Stabling and Tack: Bedding not provided – bagged shavings available for purchase. Please pre-order any shavings needed. Permanent box stalls and vinyl temporary stalls with doors (all are minimum size 10 X 10), both under roof. Stallions, horses over 17 hands and entries showing for entire weekend will be given preference for permanent stalls. Due to the limited number of stalls available, we may be unable to honor requests for non-competing horses or tack stalls. Please direct all stabling questions to Anne Sushko (563) 580-0510 gandasushko@hotmail.com Stalls will be available on Friday at 9 am. Numbers must be worn at all times a horse is out of its stall. NO SMOKING near barns. Smoking permitted in designated areas only.

Refunds: If an entry is cancelled before the closing date, all fees are refunded minus the office fee. After the closing date, the \$23 USEF and \$15 qualifying fees and/or any nonmember fees, if paid, are refunded. No refunds for filled scratches. No refunds for stabling. Wait list exhibitors who are contacted for openings and accepted are fully responsible financially to the show. No other fees are refundable after the closing date for any reason, including in the event of cancellation of classes due to severe weather or other emergency. We do request that all cancellations be called in so that adjustments may be made to the schedule.

No Shows: All "no shows" who have not contacted the show office prior to their first ride will be considered a scratch/elimination for the rest of the weekend, are subject to the \$23 USEF fee, and their time slots will be filled.

Confirmation/Ride Times: Rides may be scheduled from early morning through evening each day. Confirmation of entry will be emailed. All email addresses must be <u>clearly printed and legible</u>. <u>Provisional</u> ride times and show updates will be posted at <u>www.lec.edu/equine-events</u> Wednesday before the show. <u>Official</u> times will be posted at the show office by noon Friday. It is the responsibility of the rider to inform show secretary of any time conflicts as soon as possible after receiving provisional ride times.

Proof of membership: If entering the show electronically, USEF and USDF registration is verified electronically if valid and correct membership numbers are provided on the entry form. Copies of USEF and USDF memberships, horse recordings or HIDs must be included with your entry if it is mailed. Ponies participating in the National Dressage Pony tests must provide a copy of their official measurement certificate.

Coggins: A negative Coggins (EIA) Report listing horse's recorded show name within one year of show dates is required for all horses on grounds. Show number and stabling will not be assigned without negative Coggins.

Vaccinations: As per GR845 competitors must have vaccinations records for their horses available for inspection. Lake Erie College horse show management reserves the right to require that all competitors show their proof of vaccinations at check-in for licensed competitions at the George M. Humphrey Equestrian Center. Should current local equine health circumstances require extra vigilance on the part of horse show management, you may be asked to show proof of the required USEF vaccinations at check in.

Breed Awards: High Point Breed awards will be given to horses registered in USDF All Breed Participating Organizations and other breed awards if available. Competitors must bring copies of proof of their enrollment in their specific breed organization to the show. If a horse has multiple breed registrations, the competitor must choose which breed award s/he wishes for consideration.

Opportunity Classes are meant for entry-level riders wishing to participate in a recognized show experience but who do not wish to participate in USEF/USDF awards programs. Riders entering only Opportunity classes need not pay the USEF fee, USEF/USDF non-member fees or USDF HID fee. If riders also enter into the USDF Introductory classes, then the USEF fee must be paid. Cross-entering into other regular Classes requires payment of all missing USEF/USDF non-member and USDF HID fees. Scores from Opportunity classes are sent to the USEF and USDF but are not recorded or counted for their year-end awards. Riders in opportunity classes may compete wearing breeches and shirts (with sleeves and collar) of any color as permitted in DR 120.8. Jackets not required. Boots and protective headgear required as specified in DR120.1-6.

Pony Classes: The show offers Pony Test of Choice classes 1NP and 2NP, limited to USDF Intro, USEF training through fourth levels and FEI Prix St. Georges, Intermediate I, Intermediate II, and Grand Prix, and excluding young horse, developing horse, freestyle, rider, para-equestrian, and eventing tests. Classes are eligible as qualifying for the Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional Championships. The National Dressage Pony TOC classes will be counted towards qualification for the National Dressage Pony Cup and their year-end awards. For more info, go to http://nationaldressageponycup.com/info.html. Ponies must have a current USEF Pony Measurement Card. Owners of Ponies without a card need to let the secretary know one week prior to the start of the show. See *Pony Measurement* in this prize list for more information on measurements.

Pony Measurement: Ponies entered in FEI Pony Tests or the National Dressage Pony tests and in need of USEF measurement cards must make an appointment for measuring with show management prior to the show. The official measurement session will be scheduled for 7am on Saturday morning or as arranged by show management. Owners of ponies needing measurement will be charged a fee not to exceed \$100 to cover the fee charged by the official veterinarian required for the measurement.

Dressage Seat Equitation: will be run as a group class. The purpose of the Dressage Seat Medal Program is to promote and reward correct seat, position and use of aids in dressage. For more information about this program, check DR133

Adult Amateur Equitation: Will be run as a group class. The purpose of the Adult Amateur Equitation Program recognizes adult amateurs competing in equitation and promotes correct seat, position, and use of the aids in dressage. For more information about this program, check DR133

Freestyle Classes: USDF Freestyle Entries that require a prerequisite test must include copy of test (minimum of 63%) with the entry to confirm eligibility. CDs must be clearly labeled with entry number and music directives, delivered to the show office two hours before the class starts, and picked up following the class. Unclaimed CDs will not be mailed. You may designate an assistant to direct the playing of your music. Sound tests may be scheduled Friday from 3-5 pm or Saturday during the lunch break.

Awards: Ribbons to 6 places. **Divisions:** (JR/AA/Open) may be run concurrently as one class. Divisions will be pinned separately. No separate awards for GAIG Qualifying classes. Champion and Reserve Champion High Point ribbons will be awarded to the top two high-score entries in 1) Open and 2) Combined AA-Jr/YR divisions at each of the following three levels:

- Training through 2nd level
- 3rd and 4th level
- PSG, Intermediate I and all FEI/TOC

Intro, Opportunity, Freestyle, Young Horse, Equitation, and Materiale classes not to count for the championships.

Arena: Dirt/sand footing. Standard-size dressage arena set inside 100' X 225' side walled indoor arena. Smaller indoor warm-up 70' X 120'. Intro through Training 1 may be in a small dressage arena (20m X 40m) if scheduling necessitates. Training 2 and higher will be in the large arena (20m X 60m). Standard-size dressage arena (20m X 60m) may be set inside 100' X 225' fenced-in outdoor arena (limestone footing) for warmup-up, weather permitting.

Footing: Preparation and consulting for indoor (dirt/sand) and outdoor (limestone) arenas at Lake Erie College provided by Field Specialties and Lake Erie College.

Schooling and Lunging: Schooling permitted in the competition arena Friday 12 pm through 8 pm. Schooling will be permitted for 1 hour after last class Saturday. Lunging is allowed only in designated lunging areas. If bad weather exists, then lunging will be scheduled for indoor areas and times will be posted in the show office. Mounted schooling is not permitted in the same area as lunging.

Management Rules and Procedures:

- Show Management reserves the right to vary or add officials, to refuse any entry of any exhibitor for cause, to disqualify any
 exhibitor and/or his horse for cause, to cause an exhibitor to forfeit his winnings and ribbons for cause, to have horses
 removed from the grounds for cause, and to return any entry and/or stall fee before or during the show for cause, all without
 being liable for damage or compensation.
- Show management reserves the right to make any changes deemed necessary for the safe and efficient conduct of this
 competition. Management reserves the right to combine or cancel classes, to vary or add officials, and to refuse entry of any
 exhibitor for cause.
- **Dogs**, with the exception of service animals, are <u>not</u> allowed in the main lobby of the Learning Center. All dogs at the equestrian center must be on a leash no longer than 6' and held by a responsible adult/fixed object at all times.
- Bridle numbers must be worn by the horse at all times when out of the stall.
- No smoking in lobby or near barns or arenas. Smoking in designated areas only.
- Trailer and vehicle parking in designated areas only. Violators may be towed at owner's expense. NO PARKING BY BUILDINGS.
- Lake Erie College and its employees will not be held responsible for loss or damage to persons, property or horses

Facilities: FREE Wi-Fi, restrooms and showers available in the Learning Center. Motor home or trailer electricity is not available.

Concessions: Available on the grounds by Metz. Please note their hours may be limited as permitted in a Level 2 competition. Times of operation will be posted in the show office.

Medical and Sharps Waste: Sharps containers are located in each barn in the following locations: wash rack in the boarder barn, temp stall area by south door (door facing arena) and in the middle aisle of school barn outside wash racks. Per USEF rules, competition management may fine any individuals, including trainers, owners, exhibitors, and their agents, up to \$100 for improper disposal of needles or other sharp disposable instruments.

IMPORTANT USEF RULE AFFECTING ALL COMPETITORS

Competitors – please note that Lake Erie College horse show management reserves the right to require that all competitors show their proof of vaccinations at check-in for licensed competitions at the George M. Humphrey Equestrian Center. Should current local equine health circumstances require extra vigilance on the part of horse show management, you might be asked to show proof of the required USEF vaccinations at check in.

GR845 Equine Vaccination Rule

- 1. At Federation licensed competitions, horses entering the grounds must be accompanied by documentation of Equine Influenza Virus and Equine Herpes Virus (Rhinopneumonitis) vaccinations within six months prior to entering the stables. Horses not in compliance with this rule may be required to leave the competition grounds upon request by Competition Management. Documentation should consist of one of the following methods mentioned below. The frequency of vaccine administration should be per the vaccine manufacturers' or veterinarian's recommendations. It is recommended that vaccines are administered by or under the direction of a veterinarian.
- 2. In the case of vaccines administered by a veterinarian, the exhibitor, upon request by Competition Management, must provide documentation from the veterinarian on documenting that the horse in question received the vaccinations; name of the vaccines and date of vaccine administration.
- 3. In the case of vaccines administered by a person other than a veterinarian, the exhibitor, upon request by Competition Management, must provide a receipt of the vaccine purchase which is signed by the owner, or agent with care, custody, and control of the horse; name, serial number and expiration date of the vaccine; and date of vaccine administration.
- 4. In the case of a horse that is unable to receive either of the vaccinations due to a history of adverse reactions, the exhibitor, upon request by Competition Management, must provide a letter from the veterinarian on official letter-head stating that the horse in question cannot be vaccinated due to medical concerns and a log of temperatures taken twice daily for the seven days prior to entering the competition grounds. These horses must also have their temperature taken and logged twice daily while on the competition grounds. The log of temperatures should be provided to the Competition Management, steward, or technical delegate when requested.5. Competition Management may not amend or enhance vaccination requirements without prior approval of the Veterinary Committee. BOD 1/17/15 Effective 12/1/15

Rationale for GR845

Over the last 7-8 years there have been several high profile Equine Herpes (EHV) outbreaks that have involved the neuropathic strain of the virus (equine herpesvirus myeloencephalopathy-EHM). Influenza outbreaks don't get nearly the same attention as EHV/EHM but they do occur.

The American Association of Equine Practitioners (AAEP) publishes vaccination guidelines that are reviewed by infectious disease experts every few years. The current guidelines recommend vaccinating competition horses at 6-month intervals for both equine influenza (Flu) and rhinopneumonitis (EHV-1 and EHV-4. It is important to point out that no vaccine protects against the paralytic neurologic disease (EHM), but the intent of vaccination is to reduce the spreading of virus which will hopefully minimize outbreaks in which EHM is manifested.

In many parts of the world the vaccination of horses is covered by national law. The FEI has a requirement for all horses to be vaccinated for influenza within the previous six months. The new USEF vaccination rule is General Rule 845 and will be go into effect 12/1/15. This rule is consistent with the AAEP recommendation.

This rule change does not anticipate an increase of work for competition management. Most competitions, when horses are being checked in, require a health certificate and a negative Coggins test. The flu vaccination information can be added to either document. The requirements of this rule have not been made to be onerous on any group. However, it is important to point out that the responsibility lies with the competitor to provide documentation if requested by Competition Management. It is not a requirement that every competition verifies such documentation. If vaccination documentation will be reviewed upon arrival at a competition, it is recommended that this be published in the prize list.

If Competition Management chooses to verify the required documentation, any competitor that fails to provide the appropriate documentation of vaccination pursuant to the new rule <u>may</u> be asked to remove the horse from the grounds. If further clarification is necessary, please contact the Equine Drugs and Medications office at 800-633-2472.



NDPC LAKE ERIE COLLEGE DRESSAGE PONY SERIES AWARDS

Pony classes will be offered at each show. You must participate in at least two out of the three shows to be eligible for **NDPC Lake Eric College Dressage Pony Series Awards**. Shows included in this series are:

Lake Erie College Winter Dressage3/9/19-3/10/19Lake Erie College Prix de Villes4/6/19-4/7/19Dressage Derby of Ohio I & II6/15/19-6/16/19

NDPC Show Awards: After degree of difficulty per test is added, a ribbon and certificate will be mailed to the Champion Pony from the NDPC. This only applies to Pony Divisions, Pony TOC classes, Pony Freestyle classes, and FEI Pony Tests.

NDPC Series Awards: Series Champion and Reserve Champion will be awarded. The weighted scores from each show will be averaged to calculate the winners. You must show in at least two Pony Division classes, Pony TOC classes, Pony Freestyle classes, or FEI Pony Tests, across at least two shows.

NDPC Year-End Awards: All tests and freestyles ridden in Pony classes will automatically be entered in NDPC Year-End Awards, even if the rider is not a member of the NDPC. (NDPC Members have all scores from any USDF rated show entered into Year-End Awards, not just Partner Show scores.)

Show Awards for NDPC Partner Shows will be mailed after the conclusion of each show. Series Awards for NDPC Partner Series will be mailed after the conclusion of the final show.

The National Dressage Pony Cup showcases the exceptional talent, training, and commitment of ponies, their owners, breeders, trainers, and riders in the art and sport of dressage. NDPC encourages competition at every level, for riders of any ability of age, and ponies of any breed of mix of breeds to compete and enjoy their experience.

The NDPC partners with USDF shows around the country to offer our Partner Show Program. These shows will offer at least one 'pony only' class, but possibly more, and an opportunity to receive your USEF Pony Measurement card. You do not need to be a member to compete in a Partner Show. All scores in 'pony only' classes will automatically be entered in our Year-End Awards Program, where you will be competing with ponies across the country.

Biosecurity Recommendations

Do not share water buckets, feed tubs, tack or other equipment between horses.

You may elect to take temperatures on your horses twice daily. Report all temperatures over 102.0 F directly to the Show Manager.

Going Home

Clean and disinfect your tack, boots, equipment and grooming supplies.

When you get home, shower, blow your nose and put on clean clothes and shoes before going near other horses at home.

Regional Adult Amateur Equitation Program

The USDF Regional Adult Amateur Equitation Program recognizes adult amateurs competing in equitation and promotes correct seat, position, and use of the aids in dressage. An Adult Amateur Equitation Regional Final class will be held in conjunction with each of the nine USDF Regional Dressage Championship competitions, providing adult amateurs with additional opportunity for recognition.

Adult amateurs wishing to qualify to compete in an Adult Amateur Equitation Regional Final may do so by meeting the following requirements.

Qualifying Requirements

To be eligible for the USDF Adult Amateur Equitation Regional Final class, rider must have

- a) Earned a score of 70% or higher in any dressage seat equitation class (except walk/trot) at a USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized Dressage competition within the qualifying period of the applicable regional championship.
- b) Qualified to compete in any regional dressage championship class (excluding freestyles).

Membership Requirements

- Rider must have a USDF Participating Membership at the time the qualifying score is earned, and at the time of the Regional Final class.
- Rider must be an adult amateur, in accordance with GR1306 of the USEF rules, and be designated with USEF as an adult amateur when the score is earned, and at the time of the Regional Final class.
- Owner must have a USDF Participating or Business Membership when the qualifying score is earned, and at the time of the Regional Final class.
- Horse must have a USDF Lifetime Horse Registration when the qualifying score is earned, and at the time of the Regional Final class.

ATTENTION COMPETITORS

USEF rule DR 120.6 requires that PROTECTIVE HEADGEAR meeting or exceeding ASTM/SEI standards for equestrian use be worn at all times by anyone mounted on a horse on the competition grounds.

Each competitor is responsible for supplying management with the correct USEF/USDF association number for horse, owner, rider, trainer and coach before the day of competition. The scores of competitors who fail to supply correct numbers may not be counted towards national awards

Membership Statement


Life, senior active and junior active members shall be eligible to participate in all classes at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions at the Preliminary Level or above and Combined Driving Competitions at the Advanced Level, Dressage, Reining and Vaulting Competitions and Endurance Rides. A nonmember may participate as a handler, rider, driver, owner, lessee, agent, coach or trainer at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions, Dressage Competitions, Reining Competitions and Combined Driving Competitions upon payment of a \$45 Show Pass fee. Participants in the following classes are exempted from the Requirements of this rule: 1) leadline; 2) exhibitions; 3) games and races; 4) classes for 4-H members; 5) walk trot (exception: Friesian performance FR222) and academy classes (academy classes are classes limited to horses used regularly in a lesson program); 6) USDF introductory level tests, pas de deux and quadrille classes; 7) NRHA Endorsed Reining Competitions. 8) Opportunity classes, 9) citizens of other nations who have proof, in English, of current membership in good standing of their own National Federation, 10) USEA beginner novice division; and 11) assistant handlers in Dressage Sport Horse Breeding classes.

Motorized Vehicle Statement

Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles on the competition grounds of licensed competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. The parent(s), legal guardian(s), or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating a motorized vehicle in violation of this rule are solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses or actions resulting from that operation. Violations of this rule will be cause for sanctions against the parent(s), guardian(s) and/or trainer(s) who are responsible for the child committing the offense. Penalties may include exclusion of the child, parent(s), guardian(s), and/or trainer(s) from the competition grounds for the remainder of the competition and charges being filed against any of the above individuals in accordance with Chapter 6. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

<u>USDF Membership Benefits:</u> USDF is dedicated to education, the recognition of achievement, and promotion of dressage. For details on member benefits, including educational programs, awards, and other opportunities, refer to the *USDF Member Guide* or the USDF website at www.usdf.org.

Membership Requirements for USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized Competitions: Owners and riders, including foreign riders and owners who are not residents of the US, wishing to participate in a USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competition as a rider or owner/lessee, must have either a USDF Group Membership (GM), Participating Membership (PM), or have a USDF Non-Member (NM) identification number and pay the USDF Non-Member (NM) fee. (Note: USDF Business Members can own horses but cannot compete as riders with their USDF Business Membership.) Individuals cannot compete at a USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competition with a USDF Education Membership.

Horses competing at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions must have either a USDF Horse Identification (HID) number or a USDF Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR). Proper credentials or verification certificates must be presented to the competition secretary.

Riders and owners wishing to participate in a USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competition, and not able to present the competition secretary with verification of a USDF membership or NM identification, and USDF LHR or USDF HID, must complete a USDF Competition Affidavit Form and pay the \$5 affidavit filling fee. A copy of a completed affidavit form from another competition may also be used for verification purposes for up to 60 days. (Exception: Affidavits cannot be used at Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional Dressage Championships.)

Exceptions:

- Horses competing only in Individual Breed Classes (IBCs) at DSHB competitions, sires and dams of horses in DSHB group classes, where those sires or
 dams are not actually competing in the same competition, horses competing only in breed restricted dressage or DSHB classes at Regular Competitions
 (e.g. all Arabian, all Friesian, or all Morgan classes), or in USDF Introductory Level tests, pas de deux or quadrille, are exempt from this requirement. Also
 exempt are horses ridden in leadline, exhibitions, games and races, classes for 4-H members, walk-trot, academy, and opportunity classes.
- Riders and owners/lessees competing only in classes which are exempt from the USDF HID requirements are also exempt from the USDF NM
 identification number and NM fee requirements. Also exempt are handlers of horses competing in DSHB In-Hand or Group classes.

Memberships Defined

Participating Membership (PM): A membership issued to an individual directly by USDF. The membership year is December 1 through November 30. PMs are available for 1-year (\$90), 5-years (\$360), or life (\$1,800). A USDF Youth Participating Membership (YPM) is available for individuals who have not reached their 21st birthday by December 1 of the current membership year (\$72). A PM allows the member to compete at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions and to participate as a rider and/or owner/lessee for all Adequan®/USDF Year-End Awards and the Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional Dressage Championship program.

Group Membership (GM): A membership issued to an individual by USDF when the member name and dues are submitted to USDF through an affiliate Group Member Organization (GMO). The GM year begins December 1 and ends November 30. A GM allows the member to compete at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions and participate in the USDF Rider Awards program.

Business Membership (BM): A membership that runs December 1 through November 30 and is issued to a business or organization directly by USDF. The USDF BM (\$240) offers a wider variety of advertising benefits. BMs satisfy requirements of horse ownership only.

Education Membership (EM): A membership issued to an individual directly by USDF. This online education only membership expires 12 months after the date joined. This membership type does NOT allow an individual to compete at a USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competition.

Non-Member (NM) Identification Number: For each USDF NM owner/lessee and USDF NM rider there will be a USDF NM fee of \$35 per competition that must be collected by the show secretary and submitted to USDF, along with the USDF Report of Fees document and the \$5 affidavit fee and Competition Affidavit Form if the person cannot provide a copy of their USDF NM card. Owners/lessees or riders exempt from the NM number requirements are also exempt from paying the USDF NM fee. If there are multiple owners of a horse and all are NMs, only one of the owners must pay the NM fee. If the horse has at least one owner who is a current USDF PM, GM, or BM there is no NM fee assessed. Competition management will be invoiced for all applicable USDF NM fees not received with the USDF post-competition paperwork, along with a report listing all USDF NMs. Competition management is then required to submit the NM fees within 30 days to the USDF. An individual with a USDF NM identification number is not eligible for any USDF membership benefits. Once a USDF NM number has been assigned, a USDF NM card can be obtained from the USDF website.

Horse Identification (HID) Number: A one-time tracking number for horses (\$35). Scores earned by a horse with an HID number will be recorded, but will NOT be counted towards Adequan®/USDF Year-End Awards. A horse with an HID number is not eligible to compete in Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional qualifying or championship classes. An HID number can be upgraded to a Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR) for a fee of \$80. If a horse has a USDF LHR it does not need an HID number. An HID number is a one-time fee that does not need to be renewed.

Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR): A horse with an LHR (\$115) is eligible for Adequan USDF Year-End Awards, and eligible to compete in Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional qualifying and championship classes, assuming requirements for the owner and rider are met. If a horse has an LHR it does not need an HID number. An LHR does not need to be renewed.

Applications for USDF Participating Membership (PM), Business Membership (BM), Horse Identification (HID) number, and Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR) may be found in the following locations:

- On the USDF website: www.usdf.org. You can submit the application online or download the form and fax or mail it to the USDF office.
- In the show office at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions classified by USEF as Dressage Competitions, and Regular Competitions which are open to all breeds.

The effective date of membership is the date the form and correct fees are received in the USDF office or, if applying at a competition, the date accepted by the competition secretary, provided the application is signed and dated by the competition secretary, member, and/or horse owner on that same day.
