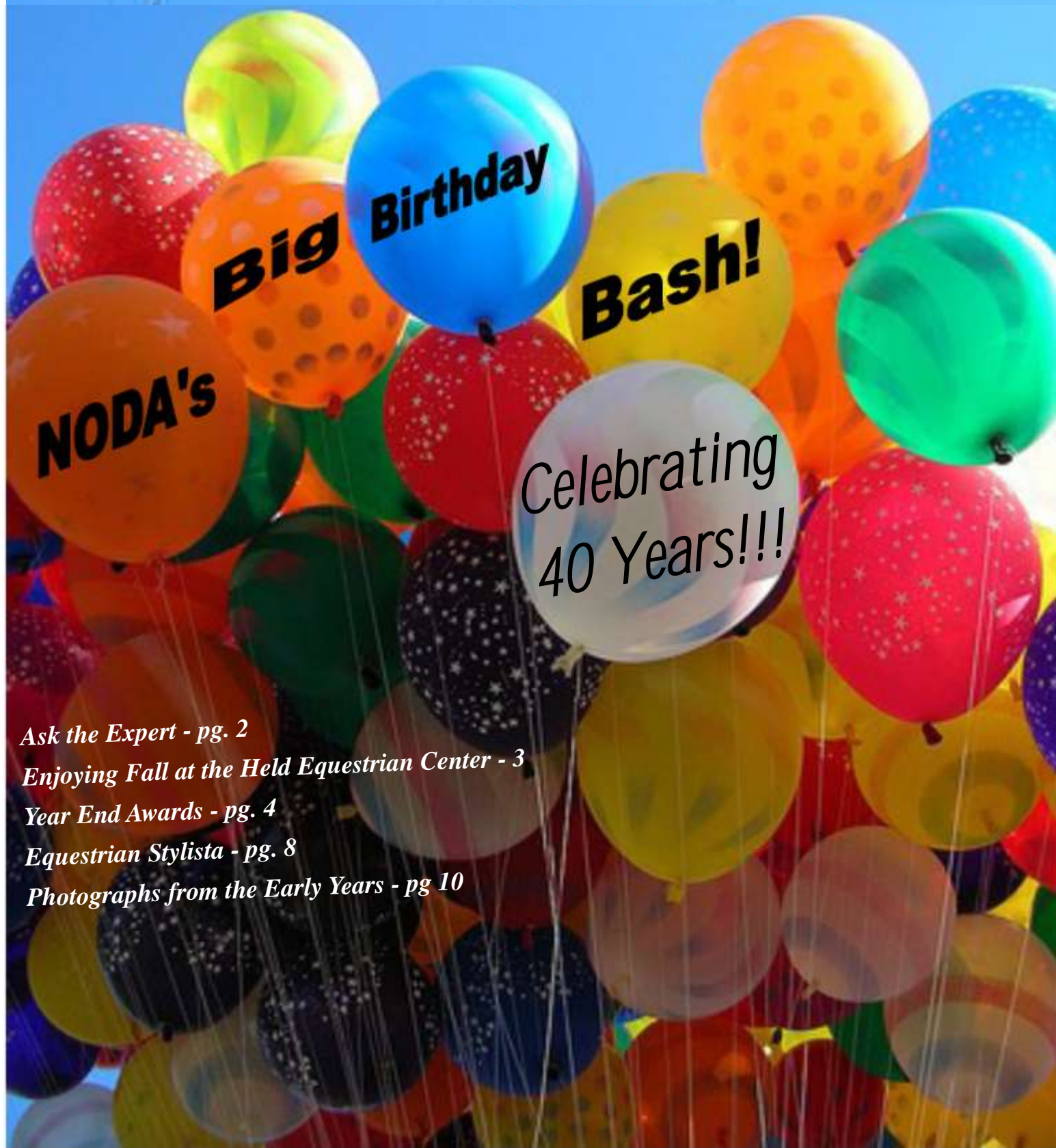

Ask the Expert Jan Ebeling Style! By: Regina Sacha-Ujcz

When teaching a green broke horse to canter under saddle what tips or suggestions do you have to teach the horse to pick up the canter?

Remember that a green horse is still very unbalanced. Don't expect a perfect transition. Ride a forward working trot on a 20 meter circle, as you are approaching the track after the open side to about the middle of the short side is the best spot to ask. Give clear aids for canter. Weight on the inner seatbone, inner leg at the girth, outer leg back as supporting leg aid. Try to keep the horses neck straight rather than bent to the inside. That allows the inner shoulder to be free. It is fine to encourage the horse with the voice.

December- Big D Espree Turnout Sheet

I thought it would be appropriate to write a review on an article of horse clothing that will surely be used this upcoming winter! I have not bought a horse blanket in quite some time, and when Archie needed a new turnout sheet, Big D was the unanimous recommendation. I ordered the Espree turnout, and when I got it I was VERY impressed! The construction is fabulous, a good heavy weight outer material with mesh lining, buckle front, long tail flap, and a gorgeous navy blue color! The fit is great too, the sheet comes up a little further on the neck, so that the shoulders don't get rubbed, or the withers pinched. I ordered my horse's typical size and it is a little roomy, but will be great for throwing over his heavy blanket in the winter. For a mid-priced sheet, it's a great choice!

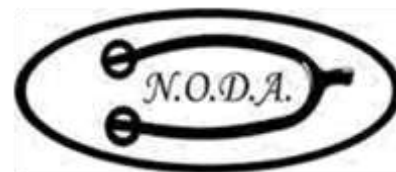

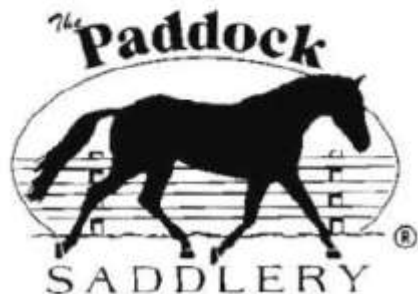
