MRSA More Common In Horse People

ethicillin resistant Staphylococcus aureus (MRSA) is up to 10 times more common in horse people than in the general population and it can spread from horses to humans.

MRSA can cause many different problems from superficial skin infections to tissue killing pneumonia. Some strains of MRSA are resistant to multiple classes of antibiotics resulting in few effective treatment options for people who become infected. MRSA can spread from horses to humans. Recently a food in an intensive care unit with MRSA resulted in skin infections in three care takers and colonized ten other care takers.

Equine risk factors for colonization include:

- 1. Administration of Naxcel, Amikacin or Gentocin
- 2. Weakened immune system from another disease
- 3. Residence on a farm with more than 20 horses

The good news is that many horses do not become persistently colonized and will clear MRSA on their own. Drug therapy for MRSA is not indicated unless there are clinical signs of an active infection. (There can be colonization without disease)

Protective factors for humans include:

- 1. Hand washing
- 2. Using alcohol based hand sanitizers
- 3. Wearing gloves

When treating MRSA it is important to obtain a culture and sensitivity to identify which drugs will be effective. MRSA in horses is less likely to be as resistant to antibiotics as it is in humans. In horses MRSA we can still use many first line antibiotics to which the human MRSA has developed a resistance. Local therapy like debridement and lavage of wounds can help to decrease the amount and duration of antimicrobials used thus decreasing the development of resistance.

We must be aware of the increased zoonotic risk of MRSA in the horse owning population and the use of infectious disease protocols. Remember to wash your hands!!!▲

ypically when a young rider's horse is recovering from an injury, they have to wait to compete until their horse recovers. It has also been my experience that there is not an abundance of capable dressage horses without riders, waiting for a young rider to pioneer them into the dressage ring. I suppose all my previous experience was put to shame, when I was asked to be on a team this year for the 2009 Lake Erie College Dressage *Prix de Villes*, on a horse that I did not own. To my surprise and delight, Pik and I had a remarkable weekend. Through a ride-off with my teammate Stephanie, I was named the Individual Champion of the High Division. I was ecstatic at how Pikeur focused in the ride-off, like he had the entire weekend and I could not have been more proud of how we worked together, especially on Sunday for the ride-off. Pik and I had great rides all weekend and our win on Sunday was the icing on the cake! Darwin Goes to Devon

t's September, 2008 and Darwin (Dream of Glory X Majaley), an 11 year old Danish Warmblood Gelding owned by Cassandra (Sana) Hale is entered to compete the Prix St. Georges and Intermediare I at Devon. Devon is the longest running and most prestigious CDI on the east coast. Joanne White has the ride. This trip to Devon is the culmination of about a years planning between Hale and White, but in reality White has been training and working toward this experience since she first laid eyes on Darwin.

Joanne White was horse shopping with a student in 2002 in Florida. On the last day of the trip they tried a Danish Warmblood gelding of

Donnerhall lineage; owned by a young girl training with Robert Dover. The horse was four; coming 5 and the young girl loved him dearly. A solid training level, the horse was regularly ridden bareback, but Dover wanted the girl to have an older more experienced mount, one that Dover felt would get to the higher levels. Darwin was for sale. White recalls "for his young age Darwin was beautiful, flashy, and had so much character; he was just oozing character. But he went straight to work in the wind and the very busy arena."

Although White didn't think he was quite the right horse for her student, she really liked him. She got on the phone to her husband and talked it over telling him she had found a prospect she could put training on and resell, "this horse is something!" she told him. The next day Darwin was vetted and the journey began for Joanne White and Darwin.

White is reserved and focused, a USDF gold medallist; she's a goal-oriented businesswoman. Separating her personal relationships and business; she rarely wears her emotions on her sleeve. But when White talks about bringing Darwin up the levels there's no mistaking the respect and devotion she has

developed for this horse. She recalls that he was always "a good worker, never spooky or distracted...Darwin is a very obliging student – he took to the training very well." It was just what White expected of a horse in the Donnerhall line – "trainability." Darwin and White achieved a level each year and whenever they showed "he was always in the top three." As White does with all her horses she "let the horse tell me where the horse needs to be." Darwin was "always a supple horse, good through the neck and back but could be dull off the legs so I always worked on keeping the hind legs sharp." As Darwin moved up the levels White remained his primary trainer but she would sit students (such as myself) on his back for the occasional lesson. Darwin would generously give the

feel of a movement or the opportunity to work on position as he stoically did his job. Darwin taught White "a horse's character is one of the things you need to look for whether the horse is for resale or for vourself." But it wasn't until 2005 that a client seeking a schoolmaster of Darwin's quality came along.

In 2005 Sana Hale was looking for a horse. She wanted a schoolmaster, a horse that could teach her the ropes. Darwin was confirmed at Prix Saint Georges and

working Intermediare I. Hale recalls she spent "many years riding the wrong horse – trying to learn on untrained horses." After years of struggling with a young or green mounts Hale "made the commitment that I want to learn and be a good rider." She already stabled one horse at Timberlane, the barn Joanne White trains out of so, "he (Darwin) was in the barn- I knew the horse by reputation and there were no surprises." With a conspiratorial smile and a twinkle in her eye, Hale says, "and he was handsome." And Hale recalls that she has always "admired Joanne White, liked her riding and instructing style" and she coveted Darwin. But Hale didn't think White would sell him to her so she never approached her on

the subject. Instead, word got around the barn of Hales interest and one day while Hale was watching White ride another horse White stopped, walked over to her and said, "Why don't you get it over with & buy Darwin?" So Hale did; with the understanding that sometime in the future White would want to take Darwin to a CDI. Hale does admit she did get one little surprise riding Darwin. Hale thought riding a schoolmaster would "pretty much be a walk in the park. Three years later I have developed an awareness of what it takes to ride dressage. He's well trained – if I do it right he'll give me what I ask –if I don't do it right; I get nothing. Darwin is helping me develop a seat and learn timing and focus one step at a time "So began Darwin's new life with an adult amateur owner under the guidance of trainer Joanne White.

Winter 2008 was White's second winter running a small boarding and training facility just outside Wellington, Florida. Darwin and Hale were back in Ohio with White flying in for monthly lessons. Hale enjoyed the winters, getting a feel for taking re-

training and instruction for the horse and rider at all levels out of Timberlane Farm in North Royalton, Ohio. White regularly travels to Florida and the Netherlands to evaluate and purchase horses for clients. Joanne White can be contacted at 440-773-4496.

Joanne White operates Bits of Advice; dressage

sponsibility for planning her rides on Darwin. White recalls, after "watching CDI's and fancy horse's in Florida" for the second winter in a row I came home and asked Hale if I could put Darwin in training for a CDI with Devon in mind." Hale readily agreed and White laid out her plan. For Darwin this meant a slight shift in gears. He was going from a winter of schooling with his adult amateur rider to a training program that would allow him to qualify and compete at the FEI by fall.

White had been off his back for about three months so she knew, "strength needed to be built up again so he (Darwin) could carry himself... sometimes he was tired behind, struggled, I let the horse tell me." White recalls that she planned his schooling week so he had some lighter days and those would include lessons or rides by Hale. White never drilled Darwin and she slowly

"began to feel it as he was coming back, I was doing less and less and him more and more...Darwin never says no, he will always do it – that's what I first felt in him when I first tried him...sometimes he just sparkles!" As the summer progressed Hale and White entered Darwin in recognized shows to try to get the necessary qualifying scores. White felt good about the judge's feedback on the tests confirming and guiding her schooling. White recalls "it sure was a lot of fun getting 70's at the Prix St. Georges!" And through it all White confides she "had to keep her sense of humor. Ride the horse and do the job." Her goal was to contest a CDI at Devon – she was delighted when the news came that she and Darwin were in.

The week of Devon, White trailers Darwin the nine hours by herself from North Royalton, Ohio to eastern Pennsylvania.

She arrives, "puts 2/3's of the shavings in the wrong stall, shovels them back out and uses her wheelbarrow to move them to the right stall" before she can settle Darwin in. White has been to Devon with Rampal and she already knows the footing is difficult, stabling not the finest, and "parking is a long way away so you have to remember everything" or hike out to get it. White knows Darwin "can work in all conditions so I make my own space and do my own thing just like I do at any show." It's raining and supposed to rain a good part of the long weekend. No matter, White goes about her business of acquainting Darwin with the grounds and letting him stretch his legs before a short schooling session. Fellow competitors include regional, national, and internationally experienced horse and rider pairs. Darwin jogs sound on Thursday. White and Darwin will compete.

The day of the Prix St. Georges dawns with more rain. The footing is "mud and slop which wears any horse out." White is "taking precautions with liniment and wraps" to protect Darwin's legs because "in this footing Darwin is working harder to do his job." White is delighted because everything about Darwin feels good. Their warm up is good and Darwin enters the ring ready and willing. "After each move-


ment he feels like he's soft and clocking it off. I am relaxing and Darwin isn't anticipating." It's what any rider dreams of; it's Darwin's best Prix St. Georges ever. They places 16 out of 41 and White knows they rode a great test under poor conditions. Hale stands on the fence, feeling pride and happiness for both her beloved schoolmaster and her instructor. On Saturday, the day of the Intermediare I, White doesn't "feel like she has the same horse, he is weary...Darwin isn't as with me" in the warm-up. As I "trotted up the ramp to the Dixon

Oval and got a view of the ring I was surprised by the wallow." White "is a little distracted" as she balances protecting the horse in the deep and heavy mud and trying to get that little bit more. White shares, "as I tried to get more; I got mistakes." White

takes the blame for the test saying, "As poorly as I rode (the Intermediare I), Darwin did a good test."

When it's all said and done both Hale and White are more than pleased with Darwin's performance at Devon. White pragmatically states, "as well as mud you get an atmosphere draped in pomp and circumstance and history. I like the quality of the competitors." Hale shares she "never dreamed that (watching someone else compete on her horse) would ever give me pleasure; but I got a great deal of pleasure; Darwin and White looked so good together. He's my horse and she's my trainer and I was happy for her and proud for them both." And Darwin? He exhibited his wonderful character as he sparkled his way through the Prix St. Georges and gave his heart in the Intermediare I. As Joanne White told her husband on the phone that day in 2002, "this horse is something!" \blacktriangle
