Early in the morning on Sunday July 11th the forecast was clear. It looked like a beautiful day was shaping up for the NODA schooling show at Grand Haven. The morning ran smoothly and all were preparing to watch **John Claridge's Century Ride** after lunch. John's ride, recognized by the Dressage Foundation, means that his age and that of his horse, Tic Toc, add up to 100! We can all look forward to this achievement. As John's ride was finishing up a few ominous clouds started to roll in.

The storm appeared to be passing by, but numerous lightening strikes nearby forced us to put a temporary HOLD on the show. South Farm Summer Horse Trial

Several NODA members were among more than 180 eventing competitors at South Farm's Summer Horse Trial over the 4th of July weekend. The 16th annual event, hosted by Sarah Greer and Chris Gable, the farm's largest recognized competition ever, drew riders from Ohio, Michigan, Kentucky, West Virginia, Pennsylvania and Indiana. The large number of entries resulted in two preliminary divisions, three divisions of training, three novice sections, and one each of beginner novice horse, beginner novice rider, and starter. Sponsors of the South Farm Summer Horse Trial included The Paddock Saddlery, Big Dee's Tack and Vet Supplies and media sponsor, *The Middlefield Post*.

As the cool breezes that had graced our area and made for a week of marathon hay-making in the heart of Geauga County's Amish country moved out and the heat wave moved in, the dressage phase kicked off the competition on Saturday, July 3, with judges Sue Smithson (North Carolina), who also served as president of the ground jury; Sue Hughes (Michigan) and Gale D'Amanda-Fox (New York). Cindy DePorter from North Carolina served as Technical Delegate.

Next, competitors moved on to the exciting cross country phase across South Farm's beautiful fields and woods. The cross country course, designed by John Williams, ranged from 27 jumping efforts in the preliminary division (wheeled at 3025 meters at 520 meters per minute, with an optimum time of 5:49 and time limit of 11:38), to 10 jumping efforts for the starter division (1140 meters at 280

meters per minute, with an optimum time of 4:08 and time limit of 10:18). Obstacles, of course varying by level, included ditches, banks and water, along with tables, coops, log cabins, a park bench and an ominous sounding shark's tooth. The course was constructed by Jump It Excavating and Equestrian Surfaces of Middlefield.

Commenting on the event, TD Cindy DePorter said "Sara and Chris and all the great volunteers take the time and the care to make this the type of competition that you want to come to because of that attention to the detail. The courses are always beautifully prepared and they are always interesting and appropriate to the level. South Farm is one of those events that is extremely rider friendly, it is low key yet you know you will get a great competition and you know that the courses will help educate you and your horse. I had been away a couple of years and I loved the course changes this year. Everything was open

and gallopey just the way that you want the courses to be," DePorter said.

By the time Sunday rolled around for the final round of this triathlon of equestrian sports, the heat was sweltering and hunt coats were optional for the stadium round. The course proved to be equally challenging for competitors in all divisions, with a total of 86 starters posting rounds without jumping faults. But, a pretty similar number of jumping faults were tallied in divisions across the board. Although there were time faults, they were generally less of an issue. By the time the victory gallops were completed, all but 25 starters ended up completing all three phases of the competition.

In the Beginner Novice Horse Division, NODA's 2009 Horse Trials and First Level Adult Amateur Champion Jennifer Milliner of North Jackson Ohio landed Rocky – an 11 year-old off the track Thoroughbred born in Chile and a great-grandson of Affirmed – in third place with a score of 33.0, not far behind the leader's score of 30.0 after the dressage phase. The duo, who has been USEA Area 8 Beginner Novice Champion in amateur and adult rider, had a rough time over fences at the event and ended up finishing out of the ribbons.

"We had a bit of a set back last year and are trying to work through it still this year. We were 2nd at Stone Gate Farm's mini trial in June, but had a slip into fence #4 on cross country at South Farm. Then we had a stop on stadium. Overall I'm seeing progress. It's not always a picnic, that's how we become better riders. I like South Farm because it's only an hour away and they

always have a nice course."

NODA member Deborah Busta of Fairlawn did a nice, steady job guiding her 14 year old Connemara, Ridgetop Dublin Grey to join the victory gallop in the Novice A division. Proving that the number 13 isn't always unlucky, the duo capitalized on the strengths of Connemara breed and jumped their way from 13th place after dressage to a 7th place finish after stadium.

Deb is testimony to personal commitment and perseverance. "Several years ago I had a very bad fall and broke my neck. I thought that my eventing career was over, but after several

months I decided to try it again. I chose South Farm to do that first event because I knew that the cross country course would be fair for the level and the fences would be safely constructed. I always include both of the South Farm recognized competitions in my schedule and I try to do as many of the unrecognized competitions as

I can. To me, South Farm is the best example of what a horse trial should be. The grounds are always meticulous, the courses are well designed and the fences are nicely constructed.

Everyone that you have to deal with from the folks who help to park your trailer to the organizer, Sarah Greer, is just great. My eventing coach, Carol Kozlowski, came to the event for the first time. Her comment to me was that it was one of the most all without having to strap on an arm band or vest from this unique view. By the way, the ride is just over the division's optimum time of 6:22 (2675 meters at 420 meters per minute, so hang on!).
