# Farewell to "Life of Reilly"

t was with a heavy heart that I said goodbye to Reilly, my wonderful horse and dance partner for the past 15 years. On Friday, November 12th, I had to euthanize my remarkable 28 year old equine friend. His last day on earth was a great day for him. We trail rode in West Woods with friends and he came home and grazed in his pasture. At dinner time he took one bite of grain and walked outside and began rolling and rolling. When he didn't get up, I knew he



was in trouble. It was colic that would end his life that day. Ultrasound showed a strangulated small intestine and displaced large intestine. I never took a single day with Reilly for granted. As he approached old age, I viewed everyday on earth as a bonus. I am blessed to have owned him and loved him, but I was particularly grateful to be with him in his final hours.

I will be forever grateful to Lynn Frey for finding my horse of a lifetime and starting us on our dressage career. With Gretchen Singleton's guidance we were able to advance to 3rd level. Reilly loved going to shows and gave me the confidence to go into the ring. I have boxes of ribbons, awards, a bronze medal, hundreds of photos and videos and fantastic memories to remind me of how much fun he was. What made Reilly so special was his personality. He was the kindest, easiest going horse I knew, truly, a gentle giant. Reilly was a Clydesdale/ Thoroughbred cross with the best of both breeds in his blood.

His last 6 years were spent on my farm, where we enjoyed many trail rides. He was free to roam between stall and pasture and it

gave me such pleasure to see how happy he was. He will be missed by the many friends and family members who rode him in his semi-retirement. For so many, he was the first horse that they ever rode. He willingly and carefully carried everyone from my 9 month old grandson to my 82 year-old uncle on his back. He learned to love children because they always arrived bearing gifts of apples and carrots. Several children went on to begin their own riding careers as a result of their first experience with Reilly.

Reilly will be missed by many people as well as his barn buddies Carson and Toby. It was an honor and delight to have owned this gentle gelding. Gretchen, please give him another hug from me.





### Once in a Lifetime By: Mary Armstrong

y friend Jennifer asked me in August, if I would like to go audit the International Dressage Symposium being hosted by Maplewood Warmbloods and Dressageclinic.com in Middletown, New York. The clinicians were Michael Klimke and Monica Theodorescu. The whole symposium was being filmed for future presentation on DressageClinic.com and DVD production.

So I went to website to check out the auditor information and see how far Middletown was. While on the website, I noticed that they had an application for demo riders and thought why not give it a try. You never know I might get in. About a month later, I found out that Gatsby and I were selected to ride with Monica in a private lesson the day before the symposium. That evening they would make their selection as to who would ride. So at the worse, I would have one lesson with Monica and audit the rest of the clinic.

Middletown is an eight hour drive from Chesterland, but we thought why not. How often do you get an opportunity to ride and learn from two world class dressage riders? Monica, herself, a 3 time Olympic Team Gold Medalist and daughter of dressage master George Theodorescu. Michael, the son of Olympic Gold Medalist Reiner Klimke, and a World Cup competitor himself and master of the in hand work.

Bill, my husband, and Jennifer, my friend, took off work to go with me for this once in a lifetime adventure. The trip was uneventful and Gatsby came off the trailer in good shape and ready for work. So after giving him a few hours of rest, we tacked up to ride and warm up for the weekend ahead. When I arrived at the indoor, I met several other symposium riders, but everyone was very focused on having their horses prepared for the weekend. Definitely no time for chit chat. Some of the other participants were Jane Hannigan, Ulla Parker, Elizabeth Niemi, John Lee Amber, Jerry Stone, and Donna Young to mention a few. I was definitely in high class company!

Friday arrived and Jennifer and I spent the morning watching as many rides as we could. Both Michael and Monica had to teach in the indoors at opposite ends of the ring, since we had rain and really high winds. At times things got a little busy, but everyone stayed focused and seemed to enjoy their time training. We saw some really high class horses and riders throughout our time watching. Horses like Ulla Parker's mount, Sabati, a young horse champion, and one of Rolling Stone Farms' stallions named Shakespeare RSF presented by John Amber.

I had a great ride with Monica. I found her to be very soft spoken, precise and honest. We worked on suppleness throughout the neck and body in all gaits. We did half pass and pirouette exercises, finishing with some piaffe and passage. I wish I could move to Germany and have that kind of instruction daily.

Okay, back to reality.

Saturday morning the list came out with the riders chosen and unfortunately we were not on it. That was okay

because I enjoy watching sometimes more than riding. Yes, I am human and I was a little disappointed, but there were so many really super combinations to choose from someone had to not get in. Oh well, we found ourselves some seats and prepared to watch the days lessons.

To be honest, I can't remember a whole lot of what went on because my day was about to completely change. From 10:00 to 11:00, Monica was to give a presentation and demonstration. Unfortunately, the horse they chose for her did not want any part of the crowd, noise or cameras. Jennifer turns to me and says "why don't you offer Gatsby to them for the demo". A few of the other demo riders said the same thing and before I knew it, we were running back to the barn to get him ready. You never saw two people put a horse together so fast. He wasn't braided, but no one seemed to care.

Within 15 minutes, we brought Gatsby to Monica and I reassured her that Gatsby would be a good boy for her and that he didn't mind the crowds or microphones. He is a real ham that way. Now you have to realize that Monica is probably only 5 foot 3 inches and I am 5 foot 8 inches and Gatsby is 18 hands. My stirrup leathers are the long ones and didn't have holes for her length. She said it was okay and off they went. Gatsby didn't mind the talking microphone or the camera's watching his every move. They finished their demo with a line of one tempi's perfectly straight. She came to a walk and said that Gatsby was really well trained. She explained to the audience that it is unusual for a horse to perform that kind of movement from a new, strange rider. That made me feel so good you can't imagine. When their time was up, the audience clapped and Gatsby just stood there with his out stretched neck smiling.

they went. This time after her warm up, she asked Michael if he wouldn't mind helping her from the ground with the canter work and pirouettes. Michael is a master at ground and in hand work and Gatsby behaved perfectly. Then the two of them worked with the piaffe, talking in German, smiling, and having a great time. They both thought that Gatsby could have really nice pirouettes and piaffe. Now I need to learn to ride like that!

So before you knew it the weekend was coming to an end. Jerry Stone asked me if I had realized just what had happened. To have Monica riding your horse and Michael working the whip from the ground just doesn't happen. It was, for sure, a once in a lifetime event. I am so proud that my horse was the recipient of those two great trainers' advice and training. In a future article, I will write about what was talked about throughout the 3 days. For now, I just want to enjoy my once in a lifetime moment.
