Did You Know?

Did you know that in the State of Ohio only a licensed veterinarian or a registered veterinary technician under the direct supervision (on premises) of a veterinarian may perform sedation and/or a dental procedure (Equilibration) on a horse.

The State of Ohio does not recognize the Certified Equine Dental Technician degree. The registered veterinary technician is a two year college degree and then must pass a national examination.

Did you know that you should ask if the dentist carries malpractice insurance? Injuries to the horse will not be covered by the policy the owner carries, unless the horse is being cared for by a professional licensed by the State of Ohio. All veterinarians carry malpractice insurance, which

is licensed in the State of Ohio, carries malpractice insurance, and is under the direct supervision of a veterinarian or is a veterinarian.

Did you know that the veterinarian and the registered veterinary technician carry liability insurance in case the owner or agent of the owner becomes injured? Always ask if the dentist carries liability insurance in case of an accident.

Did you know it is legal for the owner of the horse to sedate only his own horses when a veterinarian has dispensed medication specifically for the individual horse? It is illegal for anyone other than the owner to administer sedation. It is illegal for anyone other than a veterinarian to determine a drug administration dose for an individual animal. A veterinarian car-

covers a registered veterinary technician under their direct supervision. Be sure to ask if **your horse's dentist**

ries the reversal agent and medication to treat an allergic reaction.

This recently came to our attention as we have a client that allowed a certified equine dental technician to sedate and **float the horse's teeth. There were complications and the horse required further veterinary care. The horse's major medical insurance will not pay the veterinary bills and the dentist does not have malpractice insurance.** If the horse were to die, the mortality insurance value would not be paid. The client is lucky that neither she nor the person holding the horse were injured. The client was not aware of the consequences when she allowed a non-licensed individual to sedate and perform a dental procedure on her horse. Please be an informed horse owner!

Did you know that we have made great advances in equine dentistry? A light, speculum, and sedation must be utilized to properly examine and float the teeth. We have stepped out of the dark ages of wrestling each horse and rasping by feel.

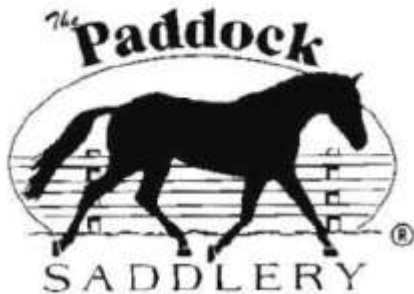

Hair Hair... Everywhere? By Clara Etzel

Now that the cold temperatures have set in and horses have grown winter coats an unfortunate but nevertheless imminent reality hits many horse owners, that is...**"its time to have my horse body clipped."** While I groom many horses for shows and maintenance, namely mane pulling, clipping legs, ears, muzzle, etc., I had never body clipped until this year, primarily for the reason that my horse, Reggie does not grow a winter coat and has never needed it done. However, the British Horse Society students were required to pair up with another student and take on the task of body clipping a horse.

As it turned out, as is always the case **when I am in any sort of "group project"** the girl with whom I was supposed to body clip did not show up to the barn on the day we were scheduled to clip. I came to find out; she had car trouble and could not get her car to start. So after the failed attempt to body clip I decided to go at it alone and asked George Halkett if I could body clip a horse on Wednesday November 25, considering many students would be gone for Thanksgiving break and the equestrian centre would be relatively quiet.

The second attempt at body clipping was much more successful and to-the-point than the first try. First off, I actually got a one-on-one body clipping lesson. George had to sedate one horse in order to clip him and I held the horse and watched while he clipped. As George went about clipping this horse, which was a piebald he detailed the type of clip he was performing as well as tips to remember when body clipping. In less than 45 minutes George had fully clipped the school horse, a clip which left on all 4 legs and half of the face.

After I put the first horse away I

preceded to body clip my school horse which was a fleabitten grey. For about 5 minutes or so George watched me as I started at the horses shoulder after shaving the division between the legs (which would stay on) and the hair around the shoulder (which would come off). Then George asked me if I would be **"okay for a few minutes" to which I responded "of course"**. **Might I add that this span of time lasted beyond the hour it took me to body clip my horse :**). The entire body clipping experience was very rewarding for me and I was very grateful for the new skill I learned.

Here are a few tips for body clipping (based on the BHS lecture I had before I clipped):

1. Your first body clip should be in October/November depending on temperature/coat development of your horse.
2. The second body clip should be done no later than the end of **February, because the horse's** summer coats starts to come in.
3. Start clipping by the horses elbow. Make sure you know what type of clip you are doing, based on your horses needs, considerations like, work load, winter showing, underweight (leave more hair on), etc.
4. Take off the majority of the hair on the body first, then damp groom the horse and go back over missed areas a second time.
5. Horses do not like to stand idly for hours. They will become irritated if the clip is lasting, say two hours. So be timely about your clip, if you cannot do that, seek a professional groom.
6. Make sure you have extra blades for your clippers, as your blades will dull out after two (but maybe only one) horses, due to grime and grease buildup.
7. Make sure you have a winter rug or

a suitable rug for the temperature outside. Do not put a clipped horse in its stall without a rug or stable blanket.

Body clipping is a hairy experience, but it is an inescapable truth when taking off the winter coat of a horse. If you cannot or do not wish to personally body clip or groom your horse, seek out someone who knows what they are doing and can get your horse beautified in a efficient manner. Proper grooming will make your horse much more comfortable and willing to work all year round. u

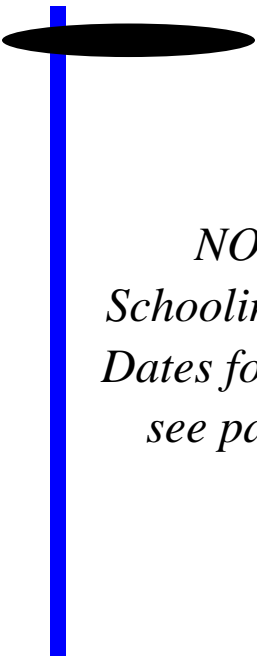
