## British Horse Society Testing at Delaware Valley College

fter eight months of preparation, on May 11, 2010 I and the other BHS girls embarked on a 12 hour journey towards Delaware Valley College in Doylestown, Pennsylvania for our BHS exams. Most of the girls were taking their Stage 2 exam (as we all had already taken our Stage 1 at Albion College). However, I and one other student from Albion decided to take our Stage 2, Stage 3 and Prelim Teaching Test. My decision to take all three remaining exams in order to achieve my British Horse Society Assistant Instructor certification meant 2 days of non-stop testing, which I was ready for.

The drive to Doylestown, which is south of Philadelphia seemed like an eternity, as we left at 6:00 in the morning and passed through Michigan, Ohio and almost all of Pennsylvania to get to our destination. I would also like to point out that we drove through torrential downpours the entire time and even encountered snow on I-80 in Pennsylvania. The drive provided the four of us in the van valuable time to study and master any material that we were still unsure about. That evening once we had arrived at the hotel, we unpacked, went out to dinner and I even managed to work out before going back to the room to study and sleep. Testing began at Delaware Valley College the next morning at 8:00 AM.

Testing on Wednesday May 12 was all of Stage 2 and from 4:00 PM-6:00PM was part of Stage 3. There were 18 students taking

Stage 2 and we were divided into groups of six. The testing was composed of flatwork (riding two different horses), jumping a 2"6" course (riding two different horses), lunging a horse, practical (tacking up, traveling) and practical oral (barn management, horse health). At the end of the day the Stage 3 candidates tacked up for cross country and dressage, prepared a horse to travel (while checking a trailer and truck over) and discussed bits and their uses. After testing was over, the girls from Albion went to a local market to eat dinner, followed by a stop at Planet Smoothie. Once we got back to the hotel it was time for me to

work out, study for the rest of my Stage 3 exam and Prelim Teaching Test before bed.

My day started at 5:45AM on Thursday May 13, as I had to get up and write out eight potential lesson plans, one of which the examiners would ask me to teach. Testing started at 8:00 AM and began with a discussion of business theory and other topics, one lecture from each candidate, a lead-rein or lunge line lesson and a group lesson on the flat or over fences. My lecture was on the roles and responsibilities of a coach. Then I taught a leadrein lesson, followed by a jumping lesson, in which riders rode through a grid of fences. After the teaching finished, the examiners de-briefed the candidates on what they liked or did not like about our coaching and tips for the future. The afternoon was comprised of the rest of Stage 3, stadium jumping (3'3"), crosscountry (3'), flatwork and practical oral. Testing ended at 4:00 PM, at which time the other two girls were waiting in the van to pick us up and begin our long journey home. After a long and once again, rainy drive back to Albion, we arrived home at 3:40 AM and were all very much ready to fall asleep: ). The two days of testing went as well as they could have gone, in my opinion and with results coming by post in two weeks, I am keeping my fingers crossed that I was up to standard: ).

### Charles de Kunffy Clinic Correct Lungeing of the Horse and Rider By: Lora Szloh

ODA was pleased to present a clinic devoted to the principles of correct lungeing of the horse and rider with Charles de Kunffy on Friday, May 14<sup>th</sup> at Topline Stables at Walden, in Aurora.

Charles de Kunffy was born into Hungarian nobility, and most of his family rode horses. He attended a riding school very similar to the Spanish riding school in Vienna. The methods were the same, strict concentration of the rider developing a seat before anything else. New students spent about a year on the lunge

line before moving on to anything else. Having visited that school in Vienna, I am impressed to see the kind of horsemanship those techniques instill in the student.

Charles began his entertaining and informative lecture by addressing the equipment for lungeing and the proper use and benefits of the different kinds of equipment.

#### Lungeing the horse

see as much as we'd like to.

Charles first discussed the lungeing cavesson. He advocates using the central ring for both directions, rather than changing sides. He then talked about the side reins, and his dislike for the type with the rubber donut was apparent and hilarious. He demonstrated how it would take about 80 pounds of pull to engage any give. It's apparent most of us have our side reins too short, and he demonstrated how to gauge the correct length for the horse so that when the horse gives in poll, there is a slight loop in the side reins. Charles also pointed out that the side reins must never be different lengths. He showed us the correct use of the lunge whip, and emphasized that the person lungeing the horse should not move from her position, but simply pivot as the horse moves around her. The ideal length of time to lunge is 30 total minutes, with the intent to supple the horse, not to take the steam out. He said you must change sides every ten minutes.

Janeen Langowski-Grava came into the arena with Lego, her FEI

Holsteiner gelding. Under Charles's direction, Janeen lunged Lego on the circle, then over a single pole, then over four poles set in a slight fanlike placement. We watched as Lego found the proper distance for himself at the working trot. Charles had the poles set into a tiny oxer,

and Janeen lunged Lego over the jump. It was clear that Lego was enjoying it, and Charles discussed how important it is to change things for the horse, not only to keep him fresh, but to develop his body.

Moving to the long lines, Charles strongly emphasized that it takes years of study to learn to long line correctly. Janeen attached the long lines to Lego and again, under Charles's direction, worked the horse at the trot and passage. Charles asked Janeen to shorten the lines and move so that she was beside the horse's inside flank, and with a few minor adjustments, Lego's trot changed dramatically.

#### Lungeing the rider

Working with two riders on horses and another person to lunge each horse, Charles positioned the riders by first having them draw their shoulders back and down until the shoulder blades felt flat and about two inches apart, lifting the ribcage and putting the chest way out. He had them bring their hands knuckle to knuckle – without reins -- and ride in this position at walk. Charles asked them to demonstrate stretching exercises, such as bringing the leg away from saddle three times, and bending the side and back to touch hand to opposite calf. Both riders, though very fit looking, found these exercises kind of challenging, I wondered how I would fare in my state of extra weight.

There was plenty of time at the end for questions, which Charles graciously and thoroughly answered. After the end of the Q&A, NODA raffled off two books authored by Charles and generously donated by The Paddock Saddlery. Charles autographed both books for the winners. He has offered to lecture on another subject when he comes back to Topline in October. Perhaps NODA will take him up on his offer.
