Spanish Riding School By: Lora Szloh

he oldest classical dressage riding school is still in operation today. It's located in beautiful Vienna, Austria. Last year my husband and I visited Prague and Vienna on vacation. Of course I had to see the Spanish riding school for myself. Outside the school they have stunning architecture, complete with massive horse statues. Just inside, one walks through their Lipizzaner museum and can purchase tickets to watch the Morgenarbeit (morning exercise). This is very different from a Thoroughbred morning ride; this is in full quadrille style complete with formal dress and music.



There are seats all around the top level above the arena where spectators can see the arena in total style. There is a crystal chandelier and a huge painting of Charles VI, along with stone pillars. Spectators like me walk in and become visibly awestruck by the grandeur. Watch this brief commercial to see what I mean. <u>http://www.youtube.com/</u> <u>watch?v=pLD3-IOh2xc</u> There was an existing riding school on that same site at least two hundred years earlier. Emperor Charles the VI commissioned an architect in 1729 to build the stunning school we know and love today. Originally a government owned school patronized by royalty, it recently became a privately managed school.

Today students are selected around 16 years old based on talent and an already impressive ability. They will spend the first two to three years on a lunge line without stirrups. How frustrating this must be for them. For the next eight years they are assigned one horse to train in addition to continuing their own training. It isn't easy and anything gained is through hard work and patience. Training ends when the rider is 60. The riders are called Oberbereiters and even today are mostly male, although in 2008, for the first time in the 430 year history of the school, two women were admitted.

For hundreds of years, the world looked to the Spanish riding school as a measure for riding and dedication to the sport of dressage. It has hardly changed for all this time. I hope the unswerving resistance to change continues. Otherwise, how and where will we measure methods used for training and teach us about our relationship with the horse? Normally I embrace change, but this school has evolved and preserved these classical methods for us. It's easy to see ads for gadgets and oddball training advice and be tempted to see if they will work. The Spanish Riding School serves to remind us that it is tried and true classical training that will bring horses through the levels correctly, even to the highest level of training – the haute ecole.





Equine Dentistry Basics By: Gian P. Gargiulo, DVM

Representation of the provided and the problems of the provided and the problems will be be a set of the provided and the problems will not be come apparent until the horse is having difficulty eating or is showing signs of discomfort with the bit. When dental issues are allowed to progress to this point, they are usually accompanied by oral trauma, maloc-clusions, periodontal disease, or tooth loss.

The reasons to focus on the dental health of your horse are numerous. Routine dental care will eliminate sharp enamel points in the horse's mouth. Enamel points are a source of discomfort for the horse that they cannot escape. These points many times will lead to trauma of the tongue or cheeks. This pain will have a profound effect on the way your horse eats, their acceptance of the bit, and their overall attitude. Proper dental care will also ensure that your horse is utilizing all of the nutrients available in their feed. Many horses with dental pain cannot properly grind grains and rough forages. If these feeds cannot be ground up they cannot be digested properly and used by the horse. This waste represents a significant cost to the horse owner. If feeds and forages are not ground down to very small sizes before entering the gastro intestinal tract, they can lead to colic or choke. Larger then normal pieces of feed many times will start to build up areas of the gastrointestinal tract that have a smaller diameter. These blockages are life threatening for the horse and many times require veterinary intervention to resolve.

To understand the need for equine dentistry, we must first realize that the equine tooth is a living tissue. It is easy to think of the equine tooth as an inanimate object, but in reality it is a complex structure that is constantly in a state of change. The equine tooth is constantly erupting (growing) at an approximate rate of 2-3 mm per year. It is this growth that results in the need for routine dental exams and floats.

As the equine tooth erupts it is constantly being worn down by the opposing tooth of the opposite arcade. In other words, the upper teeth wear the lower teeth and vice versa. Wherever a tooth or a portion of a tooth does not have an opposing structure to wear against that tooth will continue to grow and create a sharp enamel point or overgrowth. The most common places for enamel points to grow are on the buccal or check side of the upper teeth and on the lingual or tongue side of the lower teeth. The goal of the routine dental float is to eliminate these sharp enamel points, and overgrowths in order to prevent ulcerations of the oral tissues. In effect, we are doing a job the horse's mouth could not do on its own.

I am often asked, "What do horses in the wild do about these sharp enamel points?" The development of enamel points in large part is a result of domestication of the horse. By feeding coarse roughage and hard grains, the horse must change its pattern of mastication (Chewing). Instead of the broad sweeping side to side motion of the jaw that you see with a horse chewing grass, the horse must now bite down in a short chopping motion in order to break down hay and grain. Horses in the wild also are grazing almost continuously, whereas domesticated horses usually will be fed 2-3 times daily and eat for approximately an hour at a time. This increased grazing time of horses in the wild leads to more wear of these points.

Routine and thorough dental exams and floats by a qualified equine dentist are an integral part of your horses overall health at all stages of their lives.

At some shows your horse might behave as though there are Monsters at M. Not only M, but every letter could get worse! There may be:


