

Riders must be members of NODA before their qualifying ride. Riders must earn two qualifying scores of 60% or higher (Intro – First Level) or 58% and higher (Second and above), from 2 different judges. SHOW REPORT: The weather forecast for this very full show was HOT and

John Claridge Joins Elite Century Club

he Dressage Foundation Century Club recognizes dressage riders and horses whose combined age totals 100 years or more. Horse and rider perform a dressage test of any level at a dressage show or event, and are scored by a dressage judge or professional. At NODA's Grand Haven schooling show on July 11, 2010, John Claridge did his Centurion ride to join the fewer than 80 members of the Century Club. Before his ride I had a chance to talk with him.

He remarked about the ease of showing now. He felt the organization of NODA made it easier to come out and show. We talked about NODA being around for 40 years and what has changed in the showing scene. One major change he noted was the breeds of the horses at shows. In the last ten years the presence of warmbloods has taken off like wildfire. Prior to that, it was mostly Thoroughbreds and various crosses.

We also talked about lunging the rider and how that is so seldom done anymore. He felt that too many students don't have the basic seat established, and are trying to progress and move up into levels they do not really seem ready for.

We talked about his mare Tic-Tock, affectionately known as Ticky, who was being warmed up by a student in warm-up ring. She is a 20 year old offtrack Thoroughbred that John got when she was three. I watched several horses very near to her having some attitude issues with their riders. Ticky regarded them with indifference once she established she was not close enough to worry. Ticky struck me as a motherly type of mare who is sweet and protective of her riders.

John got on and went out to do his test. I had my video camera with me, so I had asked if I could record his test for him. He not only agreed, but allowed me to share the video here: http://www.youtube.com/watch?v=e5F7V1raScl&feature=email

He had nearly two years off from riding due to an injury and later a surgery. It was pretty special to do this Centurion ride, with his wife reading his tests for him.

Ticky took fantastic care of John and they did both tests so well! It was such a pleasure to meet him and his family.

Remember the Inside Leg!

he sun was shining outside and in at Fair Weather Farm during the much anticipated clinic featuring internationally renowned dressage judge and trainer, Christoph Hess of Germany, the last weekend in July. Resident dressage trainer Kate Poulin of Poulin Dressage and Fair Weather Farm, Inc., Chagrin Falls, organized this remarkable event for dressage trainer, riders, and enthusiasts alike.

Twelve horse and rider pairs actively participated in this special clinic event with 40 spectators (judges, trainers, riders and enthusiasts) hanging on Mr. Hess's every word. It is small wonder since Christoph Hess is a world renowned FEI and German dressage judge and trainer. He has worked for the German Equestrian Federation's training department since 1978 and is presently the Director of Training and Education at the German Olympic Committee. He is also an FEI (Federation Equestre Internationale) "I" level judge for Dressage and Eventing and is a member of the FEI Eventing Committee. Mr. Hess is actively involved in the education of judges and instructors worldwide, and he has judged and provided commentary for the FEI Young Horse Championships and National Dressage Symposiums.

In addition to his notoriety and accolades, Mr. Hess is a charming, tall, thin, and very kind gentleman who clearly has the health and harmony of the horse foremost in his teaching methodology. Mr. Hess speaks impeccable English and used positive teaching methods and humor to relax and assist each horse and rider combination. As most of us know, clinic riding is extremely stressful since it requires rider and horse pair to expose weaknesses in front of peers and judges to find the path towards increased riding perfection and success. Mr. Hess skillfully adjusted to the needs and nuances of each combination and positively and effectively achieved improvements towards increased greatness in each pair. The difference after only two

days of instruction was amazing as the horses became increasingly relaxed and the gaits became very large and fluid with increased swinging and "thoroughness."

The clinic was interestingly arranged to feature riders of several skill levels and horses of varying ages. Spectators were able to watch Mr. Hess address each individual need from a four-year old stallion to a 17-year old FEI Schoolmaster.

Riders and horse combinations were:

Rachel Burger riding Cas Du Chardonne (2000 Friesan gelding by Thomas 327);

Jaqueline Dickey riding God Speed (2005 Oldenburg mare by Gatsby);

Victoria Fry riding Becker (2001 Australian TB gelding by Zephyr);

Carole Love riding Relentless Love (2006 Hanoverian stallion by Regazzoni);

Lisa Nelson riding Aerosmith (2005 Dutch gelding by Contango);

Kate Poulin riding

Brilliant Too (1996 Dutch/TB gelding by Brilliant); Belisario (2005 Lusitano stallion by Quixote); Don Regale (2006 Hanoverian stallion by Don Principe);

Hannah Pryce riding Zoltan (1993 Trakehner gelding by Nemo);

Nancy M. Smith riding

Royal Waltz (2003 Westphalian gelding by Routinier); Hudson (2004 Hanoverian gelding by His Highness);

Althenea Tarulli riding Rivendell (2005 Holsteiner/Welsh stallion by Lautrec).

Christoph Hess revealed many amazing insights and training principles to assist each combination and elevate the knowledge and understanding of those in attendance.

A few most memorable insights to share:

- "The interior of a horse is in his eye."
- More inside leg! This could not be overstated here. The concept of inside leg to outside rein was reiterated over

and over and over!!! In summary, "The inside leg produces the horse!"

- "Let the horse balance his own body. Don't help so much with the hands." Frequently, Mr. Hess would ask for a small release of both hands towards the crest of the neck to insure "self carriage" of the horse. This is different from a full release (called Uberstreichen in German) which also was requested at the clinic. The former is a small release and then retaking of the contact to ensure the horse is not leaning on the reins and is in proper carriage. He would also request a release of the inside rein while maintaining contact on the outside rein to help the horses thoroughness. If restricted, the inside leg will not be able to come through properly.
- "Hands should never pull back." They should be like two sticks in your hands and you push them forward towards the mouth of the horse.
- Mr. Hess advocates the use of a small dressage whip or crop for use at the shoulder or by the rider's leg rather than always on the hind quarters. He believes strongly that it often disturbs the horse.
- Also, he took some spurs away from riders and encouraged less spur and more rider leg use.
- An interesting exercise was a four-loop serpentine with giving of both reins over the centerline. Then retake the contact for the bending.
- "Don't forget shoulder-fore before a canter depart."
- Mr. Hess was a stickler on basic gaits. This is imperative before any movements. He especially focused upon "an active, energetic and rhythmical walk. Forward walk especially after transitions."
- His kindness and pursuit of harmony was reinforced over and over again as he demonstrated concern over the proper fitting tack (throat latches long enough for proper flexion), removal of spurs, removal of whips (to encourage proper use of leg), and stretching of the horse down as a reward and relaxation between work.
- "Don't forget to ride the corners with the inside leg!"
- "Use of inside leg at the walk."
- "Bring horse properly in front of driving aids." "To get the horse 'uphill' you must first have him in front of the leg."
- "Close fingers around reins for proper feeling."
- "When the horse is running, circle."
- "A 10 m circle with proper inside leg will help with flexion."
- "Trot to walk transitions to get the horse more uphill."
- "A horse needs energy in the movement, not running."

- "When you fight against the horse in the mouth, it is cruel and you will lose the fight!"
- Riding without stirrups can be very beneficial but only for a short time. "Not the entire lesson since the rider will begin to stiffen."
- "Swing into the horse's movement."
- Riding with one hand (both reins in outside hand) is essential to test for proper seat and use of the body. (Harder than it looks, especially on a small circle!)
- "Open the horse (the frame) in rising trot easier than sitting trot."
- "The Rider must be 100% independent of reins." Lungeing is a way to achieve this essential position and independence.
- "The less you do with the hands the better!"
- "First you must have the horse in front of the leg."
- "The more you use the reins, the less active the horse will be."
- "Swing to the horse's mouth in canter," and
- 'Preparation is 99% of a movement!"

Throughout these two days, Mr. Hess very skillfully praised the good points of the riders to build confidence (especially with

judges and trainers present!) and also used humor to relax the riders.

Mr. Hess radiates love and concern for this amazing creature we call "HORSE!" Having him share pieces of his knowledge and precious time with us was an honor which will be indelibility left upon the hearts (hands and legs)



of all riders and spectators alike! His inspiration and instruction will live on in the teaching and riding of those who were fortunate to participate in and attend this spectacular event.

"This is an unprecedented event for Ohio and Fair Weather Farm" commented resident dressage trainer Kate Poulin. "We are so pleased and excited to bring this caliber of dressage training to our community and so impressed with the enthusiastic response from local trainers, riders and attendees."


