Last month I talked briefly about the election coming up this year for the two year term beginning January 2012, and I want to talk about it in a little more depth now. This year we will be electing four of the five members of the Executive Board. They are: President, Vice President, Secretary, and Treasurer. In addition, we will elect five Directors at large. These positions are: Jr/YR Liaison, Professional Liaisons, Member Liaison, and two additional Directors,

The election of Directors at large is a change from previous election years. In the past, members voted for only the Executive Board, while Directors at large were appointed. This year with the revision of the by-laws, any NODA member has an opportunity to run for one of the five Director at Large positions.

From the NODA By-Laws
Section 1. Composition. The Board of Directors of the Association shall consist of the Executive Committee of the Association and all current Committee chairpersons. For each officer, one additional member to the Board of Directors shall be elected from the membership at large. In the event that the slate of Directors at large is not filled, remaining positions shall be appointed by the new Executive Board at the first meeting of the year.

The purpose of these five positions is to ensure that the makeup of NODA's Board has broad geographical representation. Please consider one of these positions, especially if you feel your geographical area is underrepresented.

Ja Woll!

April 16th, we loaded Ozzy up and drove down to Fredericktown, Ohio to participate in a three-day clinic with Conrad Schumacher. We arrived at a farm nestled in Amish country, unloaded Ozzy and were greeted by Lynn Hamler who showed us where to go and the schedule. Then I began braiding Ozzy and getting worried about how my lesson would go! Would I be able to understand Conrad? I could hear his booming voice from inside the indoor ring. When I walked out to the ring, Conrad asked us a few questions, and I told him about Ozzy and our plans to do the juniors and my experience. We then promptly warmed up, focusing right away on low and round in the trot and canter and in the single change. We worked on a lot of long counter canter to flying change. This was something that Ozzy had been struggling with, and I think Conrad assumed that Ozzy should know these movements! I was getting frustrated, because when I would take Ozzy across the diagonal to go counter canter he would do a flying change automatically. When he would do the change I would get all tense in my body and hands. Conrad stopped us and told me to relax, that I was panicking and doing too much. When I put Ozzy together and relaxed, lo and behold, we cantered across the diagonal and continued on counter canter with no problem. That seemed to be the theme for Saturday- Relax. When I relaxed Ozzy did what I wanted. Conrad finished the lesson saying "Quietness and Determination creates a correct horse".

On Saturday night Conrad spoke to the group of riders about feel, and how the rider needs to get on and feel the horse's body and movements, not just ride the test. "Ride the horse, not the plan" came to mind. Conrad is such a nice guy, who really knows how to bring the best out of horses and riders. Despite his intimidating German accent and imposing figure, one could tell that he had a soft side as well.

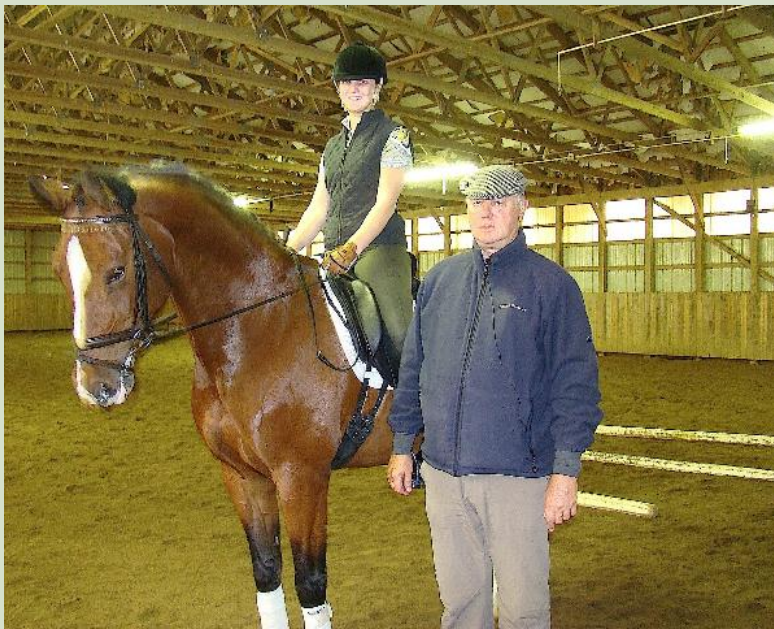
Sunday morning I rode early, so I woke up and got out to the barn, braided and wrapped Ozzy and went into the ring with

new determination. Right off the bat we started with all movements in the walk. We did half pass in walk, then turn on the haunches, then shoulder in. Once we had the correct angle and bend in the walk, we did the same movement but half way through the half pass we would pick up a very slow trot and continue in half pass. Once trotting, we did more round and down, and then went over the cavalettis that Conrad set up. Ozzy was so funny! He passage-d over those poles like Totilas! Too bad we can't harness that. Conrad also stressed that volte fixes everything. If something is going wrong, do a volte. By the end of the lesson Ozzy was so loose and supple and was traveling true and forward with a great connection. Conrad was really happy with us, and commented that Ozzy was a nice horse.

Monday we had a short lesson, but packed a lot into it. Conrad asked what I wanted to work on, and I replied (somewhat muddled and confused as with everything I said to him...) that I wanted to work on the right half pass and the walk pirouettes. So, we went half pass right in walk to half pirouette. Conrad then exclaimed "that was excellent, what is the problem?" LOL! Oh well. We did a lot of work with the half passes but really Ozzy was super. Conrad also had me ride with a balancing rein, a cotton strap that went from the girth through the noseband and up to my opposite hand. The theory was that it should do nothing unless the horse comes up in the neck then it reminds the horse to come lower in the neck. We finished the lesson happy and tired. Conrad said that with the right training Ozzy would be a great horse.

Overall the weekend was super! I loved riding with Conrad. He has such a simplistic method of teaching, but it brought out the

best in every horse and rider he worked with! I met some great people and overall had a lot of fun. I walked away from the clinic having learned something as well as gaining some confidence in my horse and my riding, which is always good! Thanks NODA for the scholarship money to help me go! Show Prep

Last month I discussed getting organized for shows but didn't discuss getting show ready. Personally I keep my horses clipped and manes pulled on a regular basis so going to a show doesn't involve a lot of extra steps for me. If your horse's mane needs to be pulled don't wait until the day before the show to do it as some horses can be irritable the next day when you touch their neck in fear you are going to pull it again. Doing it several weeks before a show also gives it time to grow in so if you made any mistakes you can adjust them. There are different techniques for pulling manes but I come from the old school where you use a pulling comb, back comb the underneath part of the mane and pull - and I don't use scissors. This can be time consuming and if you have a sensitive horse you may need to complete the mane over several pulling sessions. A well pulled mane and clipped horse always looks nice and tidy.

When I showed hunters I used to always show in full braids (mane and tail) but since I mostly go to dressage schooling shows now I only braid on special occasions (which I like). When it comes to braiding, practice makes perfect, and I can't image how many hours/days or weeks of my life have been spent braiding manes and tails. If you're going to be braiding when you give your horse a bath don't use conditioner on their mane because it will make it slippery when you or someone else goes to braid it. Also Quick Braid or gel is great to use to give the mane a tacky feeling so the braids stay in well. Some horses I've worked with are saints when it comes to leaving braids in overnight. I'm not a morning person so I'm very happy that Raina leaves her braids alone overnight. The next morning I may have to pick a few pieces of shavings out but the braids will look just like they did when I put them in. I also braid very tight. HA...last year I braided several different horses for friends and warned them all that I braid tight. Each one of them complained when they had to take them out how long it took to loosen the braids. I figure if I'm going to spend the time braiding they are going to be tight, will stay in for all weather conditions, grazing, and will stay in for more than a day if need be. If you're not sure that your horse will need to be braided the night before or the morning of the show you should have a trial run before you go to a show. Plus it will give you an opportunity to practice your braiding skills. Braiding really is an art form in my opinion. Remember to time yourself so you know how much time you need to put into your schedule for braiding.



Most of the horses I've owned have been grey and after being a groom on the show circuit for a couple of years grey or white horse don't scare me when it comes to thinking about getting and keeping them clean. Daily good grooming habits make a huge difference in their coat but some horses still need to have baths. I used to own a bay TB that I never had to bathe for shows and just hosing him off was all I needed to do. He always looked squeaky clean and shinny. Being bay if there were any manure stains I couldn't see them - or maybe I was just so happy he wasn't grey or white that he seemed like an easy keeper in the grooming category. I don't think I ever used shampoo on him other than occasionally on his tail. Using shampoo too often will dull your horses coat and can dry out the hair if you use a harsh shampoo.

Raina, and many of the grey horses I've owned, is a total pig. I joke that she isn't an American Paint Horse but an American Pig Horse! Being black and white you see everything...every stain and any dirt or dust. A bath the day before the show is a must plus touch ups or a second bath the morning of the show. The shampoo for white and grey horses works really well on the many stains she collects as does Orvus. The best way to get stains out is shampoo, elbow grease, rinse, and repeat till the stain is out. I do tend to use shampoo more often on her hocks as part of regular grooming because I have no clue what she does in her stall or in the pasture but she is a pro at grinding stains into her hocks. She is also a fan of mud eyeliner—Lady Gaga has nothing on Lady Raina. While I may not bathe her with shampoo regularly her hocks are a different story. They get extra grooming attention. There are many spot cleaners on the market and I'm sure I've used all of them at one time or another. Most of them work pretty well and are handy to have as part of your grooming tools. I suggest you see what works best for you and make sure before you get ready to go to a show that you check to make sure your horse doesn't have any sensitivities to any of the products you will be using. On white areas I have also used baby powder, corn starch, white hair spray and/or chalk on stains that just seem hang on or suddenly appear at the show.

After a bath I will put a blanket on Raina to try to help and keep her clean until morning. I've also used the full head, neck and shoulder Slezys on her, which she hates. Even with all that on and a perfectly clean stall she'll still manage to get manure stains on her overnight. I swear she must ask her stall neighbor to lift her blanket and smear manure on her white parts so she can watch my face in the morning when I pull off the blanket. They must all stand around overnight and plan ways to get extra dirty after a bath. I've

noticed, as she seems to use manure piles as pillows, the stains will go through the Slezys and I may still have to spot wash the next morning. If you have afternoon ride times and a piggy horse like mine is, you can always wait and give your full bath the morning of the show. Just make sure you budget your time accordingly. People with white or grey horses should get bonus points if they show up with a white

or grey horse and not one that is white, brown, yellow and green! While a clean and neat horse is a must for any color horse at a show those light colored horses do require more time, effort, and elbow grease. The next time you see a sparking clean one at a show tell their owner how nice and clean they look - they'll appreciate that you noticed all their hard work.

EIA (Coggins) FORMS REMINDER

USEF rule GR907.3 has been updated to include the following statement: "For Dressage Competitions, any documentation such as negative EIA certification that is required for entry to a competition must list the same horse name and description as is listed on the entry blank and on the USEF horse identification or recording documents." This is meant to guard the safety and well being of horses at the shows. When you have those Coggins tests done, be sure the horse's registered USEF name is clearly marked. Do not use your horse's "barn name."

- Competitors must be NODA Members prior to earning scores submitted.
- Awards presented at the 2011 Annual Awards Banquet
- Submission of 2011 Scores must be Postmarked by OCTOBER 22, 2011
- Scores must be sent on the official report form and include copies of the Dressage Test Cover Page OR a USDF Score Check.
- Scores obtained from Opportunity Classes (offered at NODA Recognized Competitions) may only be submitted for Unrecognized Year-End Awards.
- Everyone must submit FOUR (4) NODA BUCKS with their 2011 Awards Application for each horse/rider combination. This includes Professionals, Adult Amateurs, Young Riders and Junior Riders.
- Separate forms must be completed for each division or award.
- ALL SCORES, including those from NODA schooling shows, MUST BE SUBMITTED BY THE COMPETITOR
- 2011 Competition Report Form can be found in your 2011 NODA Handbook and on this webpage.

- All association trophies are rotating unless otherwise noted. Winner may have possession for eleven months, at which time trophy must be returned, in "as received" condition, to NODA.

Year End Championship ribbons, awards and scholarships in the amount of \$75.00 each will be awarded to the rider/horse combination with the highest average score in each of the following divisions. Ribbons will be awarded to tenth place. One score from 4 different judges is required (If the test score is from a panel of judges, the combined average score is the only score that can be submitted). Freestyle and Young Horse scores may not be used. A horse and rider combination that has previously won a year end championship is no longer eligible for awards at that level or lower level.

The Gallant Lad Trophy given by Margaret McElhany of Valley Riding Inc., to recognize the outstanding performance by the vintage horse (15 years or older). Scores **MUST** come from the NODA Recognized show or NODA schooling shows. Award is based upon 3 scores from 3 different judges at any level of competition. Scores from different levels of competition may be combined. A copy of registration papers or a letter stating the horse's age must be submitted with the scores. (*)

The Gretchen Singleton Vintage Award Trophy given by



Kathy Dennis and Sally Gries in honor and memory of Gretchen Singleton, is awarded to the high scoring amateur rider who was 50 years of age or older when scores were earned. Award is based on 4 scores from 4 different judges from Recognized or Unrecognized competitions

and can be a combination of scores from multiple levels. *Birth date must be submitted.*

The Moody Mare Trophy given by Kimberly Moody. This

Scores may be from Recognized or Unrecognized shows at any level of competition. The award will be given to the highest average score based

on 4 scores from 4 different judges from the **same level** of competition. A copy of registration papers must accompany the submitted scores

The Joan Rapp Trophy given by Gail Patton in memory of



Joan, the founding president of NODA, who taught at Red Raider for many years. It is awarded to the horse trained and ridden by a non-professional who best demonstrates that dressage training benefits a horse in all disciplines. In addition to sending 3 scores from 3 different judges (from Recognized, NODA, or NODA approved schooling shows) evidence of winning 3 ribbons (1st, 2nd or 3rd place) in one or more riding disciplines

other than dressage must be submitted. Driving classes may count. If combined training results are included, placings must be from the entire event, not just the dressage phase.

UNRECOGNIZED (SCHOOLING) DRESSAGE COMPETITIONS

Scores from NODA and non-NODA Schooling Shows may be submitted if the following criteria are met:

- You are a Non-Professional Junior or Adult Amateur Rider.
 - * If you are 17 years old or younger on December 1 of the previous year, you are a Junior.
 - * If you are 18 years old or older on December 1st of the previous year, you are an Amateur.
 - * If you are an adult who accepted payment for equine training or teaching, during the past 12 months, you are a Professional. For complete definition of Professional see www.equestrian.org. Scores will count from the date of NODA membership. Scores from NODA and non-NODA schooling shows may be submitted if the following criteria are met.
- Show is completed on or after the date you joined NODA.
- Show is open to all NODA members and it has been advertised in the NODA newsletter or web site or a prize list has been sent to all NODA members. (Exception: NODA Championship Show Scores are eligible)
- The judge must hold a current USEF dressage judge license OR have held a card in the past OR be a USDF "L" program graduate.

- Riders who submit scores from Introductory classes held at non-NODA schooling shows may specify whether these scores are to be counted for Introductory Level-Rider or Introductory Level-Horse (but not both) awards.
- Novice Training Level riders who compete at non-NODA shows not offering Novice classes may submit Training Level scores towards Novice awards.
- For each division or award for Unrecognized competitions, 1 score must be from a NODA Schooling Show.
- Eligibility, in all cases, is dependant upon meeting requirements of NODA Schooling Show Rule 5) Class Restrictions.

Year End Championship ribbons, awards and scholarships in the amount of \$50.00 each will be awarded to the rider/horse combination with the highest average score in each of the following divisions. Ribbons will be awarded to tenth place. 4 scores from 4 different judges are required. Exception: For equitation and for Second Level and above, only 3 scores are required. Freestyle and Young Horse scores may not be used. A horse and rider combination who has previously won a year end championship is no longer eligible for awards at that level or lower level. If a horse and rider combination wins at an FEI Level, the only way to be eligible again is if they compete at a higher level the next year.

Paddock Saddlery on behalf of NODA and given in memory of Laddie Andahazy, a longtime member, judge and driving force in the equestrian community, perhaps most noticeably at Lake Erie College. It is given to the adult amateur dressage rider who was a novice at the beginning of the competition season and performed exceptionally well in our NODA schooling shows. Two scores from 2 different judges at NODA schooling shows must be submitted.

The Rowdy Memorial Trophy given by Cheryl Lee to



recognize outstanding effort by an adult amateur competitor. The award is based upon the score obtained at the NODA schooling show championship plus the highest score earned at a NODA schooling show.

The Sweeter Award donated by Janeen Langowski to



recognize the outstanding effort by a junior rider, 14 and under. The award is based upon the highest score obtained at the NODA Schooling Show Championship plus 3 highest scores earned from the same level of competition from 2 different NODA Schooling Shows. This award is a non-rotating trophy that is awarded permanently to the recipient.

The Full of Grace Award given by Leslie Grimm. This award is



for a Draft or Draft-Cross horse shown by owner. Owner can be an adult amateur, junior/young rider or professional. Award is based upon 3 scores from 3 different judges at any level of Recognized or Unrecognized competitions. One score must come from a NODA sponsored show. Scores from different levels of competition may be combined. A copy of registration papers or a letter verifying the horse's lineage must accompany the submitted scores. (**)

The Determined Effort Award given by Niki Sackman to



recognize outstanding effort by a traditional stock horse shown dressage. Awarded to the junior/young rider or adult amateur riding a registered American Quarter Horse (AQHA), American Paint Horse (APHA), or American Mule (ADMS), with the highest average based upon 4 scores from 4 different judges at any level obtained at dressage schooling shows (The judge must

hold a current USEF dressage judge license or have held a card in the past or be a USDF "L" program graduate). The 4 scores must be obtained from the same level of competition and at least 1 score must be earned at a NODA Schooling Show. A copy of the registration papers must accompany the submitted scores. (**)

The judge must meet NODA's criteria for Unrecognized Dressage Competitions.

Events / Mini-Trials - Unrecognized: A Scholarship in the amount \$50 and ribbons to 6th place will be awarded to the horse/rider combination with the best average scores earned in the Dressage portion of a "Mini-Trials Event". One score from 3 different judges at any level required. A copy of the entire score sheet showing points earned (not just penalty points) including judge's signature must be submitted. The judge must meet the NODA criteria for Unrecognized Dressage Competition.


