Compounded Medications

ecently our clinic had to order Isoxuprine in powder form from a compounding pharmacy because the regular tablets were on a manufacturer backorder. Now that the tablets are again available and in stock, clients have continued requesting the compounded powder. There are a few things you should know about compounded medications:

- 1. The Animal Medicinal Drug Use Clarification Act allows compounding of drugs as long as a product is not already commercially available.
- 2. The compounded drug is only as good as the integrity of the compounding pharmacy. Compounding pharmacies are mostly self-regulated with little oversight from the FDA.
- 3. A compounded product is not a generic equivalent and cannot be substituted for an available FDA approved product.
- 4. A compounding pharmacist may formulate an approved drug to change the method of delivery i.e. tablet to paste.

- 5. A valid veterinary client-patient relationship must be in place to dispense a compounded medicine. This means the patient must have been seen recently.
- 6. Veterinary clinics can only keep a 72 hours supply of a compounded medication on hand for dispensing.
- 7. Veterinary clinics must ask the compounding pharmacist what grade of materials are being used pharmaceutical versus bulk grade or chemical grade.
- 8. Some medications are not as efficacious when compounded.
- 9. By law, the longest expiration date on compounded drugs is 6 months.

These are the reasons why Visiting Vet researches the compounding pharmacies and why the expiration dates are so short on compounded medications.

Show Prep and Organization

pring is finally here! Frankly, I was beginning to doubt it would ever arrive. For me, with spring come plans to go to horse shows, and that means getting organized and thinking about where I want to show and what my goals are for the year. So I thought I would put all my notes and checklists together in one place and share them with all of you.

Coggins Test

There are many things that need done well before show season starts, including scheduling vet visits for vaccinations and a Coggins test. Make sure before you send any entries in that you have a current negative Coggins test that shows the name you plan to show your horse under. While NODA doesn't care if I show my horse under her barn name of Raina or registered name of Mercedes Colortyme, if I submit any points to my breed registry they have to be earned in her registered name. Since I never know what I may do in any given year I normally get my Coggins test in her registered name so I'm covered. Make sure if your 2010 Coggins expires in spring of 2011 you schedule at least several weeks for all the paper and blood work to be processed before your 2010 Coggins expires. All NODA shows require a copy of a current negative Coggins, and you don't want to be left sitting at home because your Coggins test has expired.

Entry forms

Check open and close dates so you are sure to send your entries in plenty of time and within the time frame allotted. Shows often fill up and if your entries are received late you may be placed on a waiting list without any guarantee of securing a ride time. Relative to NODA show forms, be sure to fill out all the spaces on the entry form, including the correct tests you wish to ride, your status (JR/YR & age, AA, or Professional), and all the necessary signatures. Include all the correct names and make sure they are legible. Just because you know what your horse's name is doesn't mean the show secretary knows what it is or how it is spelled correctly. Trust me, as I work with I guy whose chicken scratch... er... I mean handwriting I cannot read at all, sometimes it is hard to read someone else's handwriting, so please print legibly. Don't forget to include your check in the correct amount (class fees and office fee). Over the years working in various show offices I've heard people ask, "Why do you want to know who I'm trailering with?" Well, that is so the secretary can try (no promises) to schedule your rides accordingly or schedule rides so that trainers can be all places they need to be. Scheduling can be a real balancing act.

Before you send off your entries, review the show prize list to see if there are any rules that apply to you that may have an

impact on your plans for the season. For instance, you don't want to start off in one division only to find that another would have been a better choice. If you have goals to apply for NODA Year End Awards or ride in the NODA Schooling Show Championship, make sure you know the rules and qualification requirements, and if you have any questions to contact the show committee. The schooling show prize list and contacts for both schooling shows and recognized shows are on the NODA website at www.nodarider.org. Don't be afraid to ask for clarification. It is better to be prepared so you don't run across any surprises at the end of the year. Also remember that NODA 2011 Membership is required prior to earning scores for any year-end awards for both recognized and unrecognized shows. You will also need to submit 4 NODA Bucks with any year end awards you apply for. As Dee Liebenthal pointed out under *Greetings from the President* in the February issue of the NODA News "Do not wait until the last show or event of the year to volunteer. If you do and there is nothing available for you to earn your 4 NODA bucks, you will be out of luck! There will be NO exceptions. Work must be completed in the 2011 competition year. Another reminder for the 2011 year: Do not let the deadline slip by for sending in your scores for Year-End Awards. THERE WILL BE NO EXTENSIONS. So please pay attention to important deadline dates."

Tests and copies

As most of you are aware, there are new 2011 tests (in effect from 12/1/2010 through 11/30/2014) so make sure you have the current tests. Nothing worse than trotting down centerline, starting your test and hearing the bell ring because you're off course. I typically have several copies of the tests with me. The small plastic coated test booklets are always nice to keep in your grooming tote but more than once I've heard from readers (especially those of us whose eyes aren't as great as they used to be) that they can be hard to read. I make special copies for my trainer in large font and put them in plastic protector sheets so she can very easily see what the text says. I do memorize my tests but it is nice to have a reader in case you have a senior moment or a case of nerves and forget where to go. One show, I had a reader who was so distracted with other things going on that she was reading three movements behind where I was riding! Fortunately, I had memorized the tests, so I knew where I was supposed to be.

I put test copies in a zip-up three-ring binder, along with copies of my Coggins test, registration papers, ride times, show rules, and checklists - basically anything I may need at the show - and often I have multiple copies of certain documents. I like to put each document and its copies in the top

loading plastic protector sheets. If a show office needs a copy of something I can very easily slide it out and give them a copy to keep. I also go as far as to put dividers in the binder to separate tests and then each divider section after is for each horse I own. Right now I'm only showing one of my horses but a couple of years ago, between my daughter and me we had three horses going to each show. Having everything organized in one place was great and very helpful! I find that with a zip-up binder, sheets of paper don't fall out onto the floor of the truck or the trailer tack room floor. We all know how crazy things can get at the show. It is important to take only the copies of important documents so if for some reason you misplace the binder you haven't lost your original documents and then have to pay to get replacements of things like breed registration papers.

Show Prep and Packing

Getting your horse "show ready" is an undertaking in itself, and I'll talk about that in a later article.

In what now seems a distant past life, in my 20s I was a groom for a couple of A Circuit hunter/jumper facilities. It was the norm to ship 10 to 13 horses to a show. They stayed at the show grounds for a week or more, and then it was on to the next show. I became very good at getting organized and having a system and checklist so everything got done. I learned my lesson a few years ago when I didn't use a checklist and I got to the show and discovered my daughter hadn't packed her pony's bridle.

There tend to be several kinds of packers: those that pack everything, those that pack the bare minimum, the neat organized packer, and the "just throw it in the trailer" packer. I'm the neat organized packer that over packs! New airline baggage regulations killed me on my last vacation - I had to simplify, oh no! What you pack and what you put it in depends on how long you'll be gone, what you and your horse need, and whether you have your own trailer. I do not have the luxury of owning my own trailer so I have a monogrammed rolling tote that I use for short trips. It holds my saddle, bridle, grooming tools, and more. Plastic or rubber totes and tack trunks work great, or if you have your own trailer with a tack room you can put everything in its place. I like to pack everything the day before so all I have to do is roll my tote down the aisle and into the horse trailer. I go through my checklist to make sure I have anything I think I may need, plus stuff I don't need but take anyhow because I'm one of those "what if" people. I also take extras in case something was to break. Of course, after the show when I'm unpacking everything including the kitchen sink, I'm wondering, "Why did I pack all this stuff?"

I load the horse trailer with all the hay I'll need for the day, buckets, a water tank filled with water from home, chairs, umbrella, broom/rake/shovel... anything I might need. If my

horse will need grain while at the show I pack it in a zip lock bag. If I'm going to be gone for more than one feeding, say for a weekend, I put each feed serving in a zip lock bag with my horses name on it and "AM" or "PM." That makes it easy at the show grounds to just pull out a packet of feed for each horse. Getting ready the day before makes everything easer the day of the show. All you have to do is wrap and load your horse the day of the show, because you packed everything the night before. I lay my shipping wraps out the night before so I know where they are. A little less stress the day of the show is always nice.

I have an Excel spreadsheet that lists everything I own along with serial numbers, any identifying marks, etc. It is nice to have an inventory list especially in the event of a major loss, and I keep a backup in my online Dropbox account. All of the totes that contain items I'm not using are labeled so I know what is in each tote, and each tote has a number. I just love organizational stuff -- I could be on one of those TV shows.

Show Day Timelines

Timing is a big thing for me on the day of the show. I can get stressed out when I go to shows with other people, especially if they are unorganized and don't follow a time schedule. I start with my ride times and work backwards. Once I know when my earliest ride is, I figure out how much time I need to school and warm up my horse, tack up, unload, go to the show office, travel to the show grounds with extra time in the event of traffic problems, how long will it take to load the horses, wrap the horses, spot clean/or bathe, and braid if need be. Then I figure in how long it takes me to get to the barn, any at-home packing (most of which I do the night before) and whether I am going to eat breakfast before I leave. Then I have four times in my mind that are important: the time I need to get out of bed, the time I need to be at the barn, the time the trailer needs to be pulling out of the drive, and the time I need to be on my horse at the show. Yes, I know, I can seem like a drill sergeant the day of the show because I budget all my time, but it really helps me to feel relaxed, to be organized, and not stressed out that I'm late. I even have special "going with" times -- depending who I am trailering with I may have to factor extra time in because I know some people aren't as organized as I am. If it takes an hour to get to the show grounds and we need to be pulling out by 7:00 am to be there by 8:00am, that doesn't mean you show up at the barn at 7:00am to get your horse out of the stall. Talk about a way to give me a heart attack!

Being prepared and organized really can help eliminate a lot of stress that can be associated with showing. Also making good habits can make a difference. Once you get into the habit of doing certain tasks the task just becomes natural and you don't have to think about it as much. You can be relaxed and have fun. Good luck at the shows!
