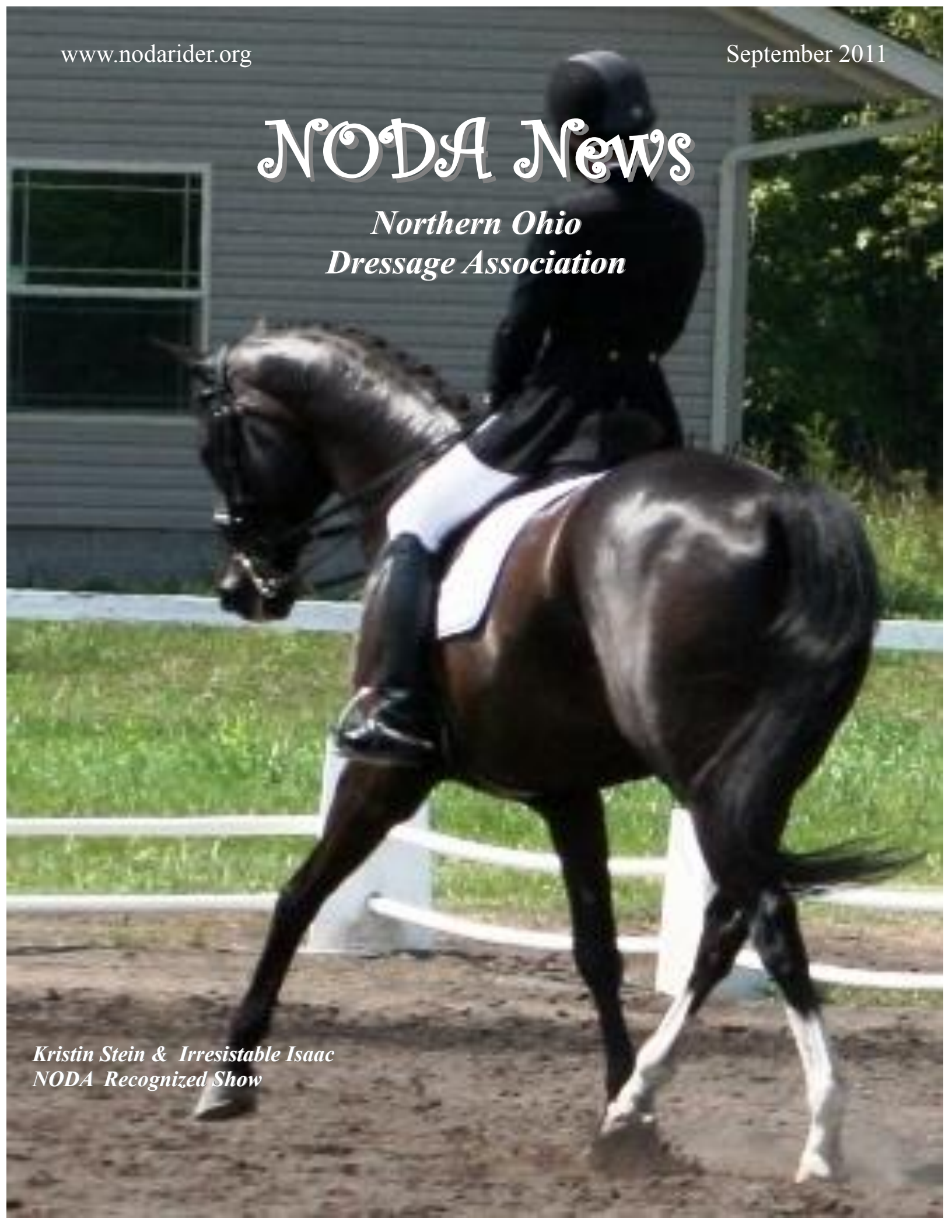

The Northern Ohio Dressage Association and Lake Erie College are pleased to announce a clinic with Reese Koffler-Stanfield, successful FEI Dressage Rider and USDF Certified Instructor/Trainer. The clinic will be held October 29 and 30, 2011 at the Lake Erie College Equestrian Center.

Reese's riding and training career has progressed from a successful Advanced Young Rider to a

Performance competitor. She has earned USDF Bronze, Silver and Gold Medals and is a USDF Certified Instructor/Trainer through Fourth Level, which is the highest USDF certification currently available. Among her many accomplishments, she has been a demo rider at two USDF National Symposiums and was chosen to participate in the inaugural Hilltop Young Horse Trainers' Conference.

Reese's current Grand Prix partner is Goubergh's Kasper, a 16.3h Dutch Warmblood gelding. In 2010 they ranked in the top 20 in the fight for a spot on the WEG team and placed fourth in the Grand Prix Freestyle in the Kentucky Cup CDI*** and Lamplight CDI***.

NODA Video Clinic Opportunity with Nancy Stanton and Lauren Tisdale

A moment I was very anxious about arrived last week when I opened my mailbox and discovered the video of my May 29th ride at Rocky River Stables NODA Schooling Show. This was not my brightest moment in the saddle and I was very nervous to play the DVD and see what my ride looked like and, even worse, hear the comments that were made. However, Nancy Stanton and Lauren Tisdale were so positive, encouraging, constructive, and very helpful in their comments that my fears were quickly put to rest. No, it wasn't the prettiest ride, but in some odd way I'm happy about that. It is so nice to have professionals of their caliber give you the tools you need for those moments when you need them most. All of the comments that they gave were spot on and correct.

I'll admit I am a bit embarrassed to have any of you watch my video (on the NODA You-Tube page – <http://www.youtube.com/watch?v=B4e53sJ8YAc>) but the comments are so helpful and we have all had those less than stellar rides. My errors may be the same ones you deal with and I hope you can learn from my mistakes. For example, Nancy and Lauren told me to send my horse forward and let her stretch down and into the bit, allowing her to use her hind end and topline, and they talked about the importance of inside leg to outside rein and having a proper body position, to name a few of their pointers. I realize I need to engage the hind end and send my horse forward, allowing her to stretch down into the bit. Right before I went into the class my mare blew up in front of the judge's stand, and that really rattled me. If you watch the video you can see I was hesitant to send her forward for fear she would blow up, and I had such a choke hold on the reins there was no way she could use her topline. I was stopping the forward motion. The result was a hollow back, a tense and annoyed horse, and an unconfident rider. Of course mentally telling myself to send my horse forward when I know she wants to spook is hard to do but must be done – direct the energy and control where it goes. Thankfully my mare is such a pleasant horse and really tries to please. I could also see where I need to improve my body position and really listened to the comments Nancy and Lauren gave. For some reason I seem to forget I have elbows and I lean forward with my shoulders -- but I'm working on that. I haven't seen a video of myself riding in years and this was such a valuable tool for me. I think I may need to get videos of myself more often!

Since that ride I've been taking weekly lessons with a dressage trainer who is helping me improve. We watched the video clinic together and we could see such a difference from that ride in May to today. I am using all the comments that Nancy and Lauren gave me to my benefit. The NODA

Video Clinic is truly an excellent educational opportunity and I would highly recommend it to everyone. I know some of us are self-conscious or nervous about having a video out there for others to see, but the critique that Nancy and Lauren gave was so positive and educational that it makes it well worthwhile. One day I would like to ride in a clinic given by Nancy or Lauren. I also want to thank Dan Crudele for generously giving his time by coming to the show to record the riders that signed up for the clinic, and making the DVD.

The DVD that I received was very nice. It is in a two picture format (picture within a picture). The large main picture is of the ride and a smaller box in the corner shows Nancy and Lauren giving comments throughout the ride. Listening to Lauren and Nancy's comments while watching the ride is very helpful as you can see what is happening – or maybe not happening, like the lack of impulsion in my case. There were two other riders on the DVD that I received, and watching those rides while listening to the comments was educational, too. This really is something I would recommend to everyone. Thank you so much Nancy, Lauren, and Dan!

The NODA video clinic is a pilot program offered to Junior/Young Riders and Adult Amateurs to improve their skills by having their riding performance and horse's performance critiqued by Northeast Ohio professionals.

This program will be provided free to NODA Members and will consist of:

- Taping of horses and riders at either a USDF Recognized Show or NODA Schooling Show
- Your ride/test will then be reviewed with the clinicians
- The clinicians will then provide feedback, which would also be taped
- The taped ride and clinicians' responses will be combined to create a short educational clip of 15 – 30 minutes that will be posted on either the NODA website or YouTube
- A DVD will also be produced and distributed to the NODA Members selected to participate in this program

By never overfacing the horse and rider, but pushing them to do their best, Nancy gets the most out of her students. She has trained every type of horse, from

recently broke babies to improving the seasoned Grand Prix horse. Her varied and extensive background has helped her train hunter/jumpers, eventers and dressage riders. Nancy has earned her USDF Bronze, Silver and Gold Medals.

- Dale Lappert will be NODA's delegate to the USDF Convention.

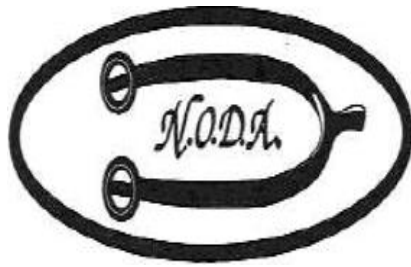
Professional Liaison Report: Mary Dana Prescott

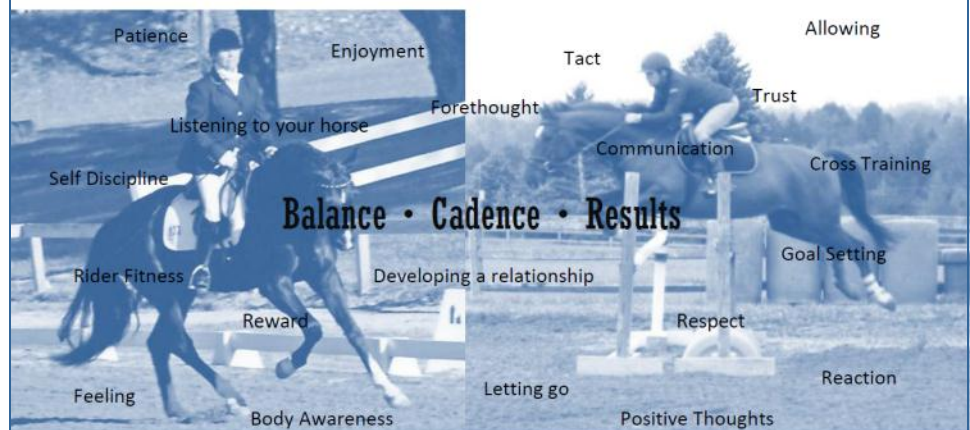


