# Barb Soukup Coaches Intercollegiate Dressage Association Champions by Mosie Welch

n April 30 and May 1, 2011, over 100 student equestrians from more than 20 colleges and universities throughout the United States participated in the Intercollegiate Dressage Association's (IDA) 9th annual National Championship at the Canterbury Equestrian Show Place in Newberry,

Florida. The Lake Erie College (LEC) team, under the direction of NODA member Barb Soukup,

took home top honors in the highly competitive field. The LEC IDA team included senior Amy Ertas riding at First level, junior Sarah Simmons riding at Upper Training level, junior Autumn Harvey riding at Introductory level, and junior Meghan Marcinkewicz riding at Low Training level. Barb and the LEC IDA team she coached were also honored by the United States Equestrian Federation (USEF) at the USEF Annual Meeting on January 14, 2012 during the President's Luncheon. In the invitation to the award ceremony the USEF commended the team, stating:

"Through teamwork, dedication and talent, your team has proven to be the epitome of intercollegiate equestrian sport in the Intercollegiate Dressage Association."

Barb recalls, "We were invited up on stage to receive our award in front of a large audience. It was very

exciting for my team and me...and very fulfilling to be recognized for our hard work by our national governing body, the United States Equestrian Federation." The other student teams and coaches invited to this inaugural event, designed by the USEF to recognize student equestrian programs, included members of the American National Riding Commission, Intercollegiate

Equestrian. The USEF has also
asked Barb to present a brief
lecture to a group of younger
equestrian award winners about
the IDA and what is expected of
team riders. It is dedication to
the sport of dressage and
commitment to excellence that
prepared Barb Soukup to coach

the IDA team to high honors.

Barb started her horse career young and really only

wanted to "fly over jumps." None of her family shares her passion and love for horses, so she isn't exactly sure where she got her interest in horses. When Barb began to study dressage seriously she "had the good fortune of meeting"

and training with Charles de Kunffy." Taking instruction from de Kunffy for eight years, Barb learned not only riding, but also classical theory, teaching skills, and how to develop an eye for what she was seeing. Barb says de Knuffy would have her judge rides and advised Barb that it was wise to have judging skills, because as a clinician one must "assess a horse and rider combination quickly and come up with something you can help them with in that short span of the clinic." That stuck with her, so when NODA hosted the USDF Learner Judge program, which teaches participants how to evaluate dressage performance at Training through Second Level, Barb jumped at the opportunity to expand her judging education. She graduated from the L program with

distinction, which is required if one wants to apply and train for the USEF "r" Judge status.

Barb says that part of her secret for developing the potential of her IDA team members is taking "each horse and rider separately. At home, I try to figure out how they learn and set up their lessons accordingly." But IDA competition rules requires that team members draw lots for their horses and have only ten minutes to warm up. A trained and

practiced eye allows
Barb the opportunity
to provide quick
advice to team
members, but she
also realizes the need
for "thinking riders."
At home Barb says
she helps "riders to
understand how and
why they work a
horse through various
exercises. My job as a

trainer is to create independent, thinking riders," which is crucial to success in IDA competition. The students get on "horses unknown to them, identify the major issue and what they need to do to remedy it in order to ride a successful dressage test." Barb stresses that the "more horses they (the students) can ride, the more tools they have for future reference." And on the IDA Team, Barb stressed teamwork – everyone helping each other to accomplish the more. The team motto is TEAM = TOGETHER EACH ACCOMPLISHES MORE!

Four years ago Barb was asked to coach the LEC IDA team temporarily until they found a replacement for the coach that had recently left. That temporary assignment turned into four years of dedicated leadership for the IDA Team as well as teaching a class in Advanced Dressage at LEC. During Barb's term as coach she developed the team's potential into positive results, culminating in LEC IDA National Team Championship and most recently the award recognition from USEF. NODA is proud to recognize Barb's accomplishments and her commitment to dressage in the academic community.


Although Barb Soukup has stepped down from coaching the IDA Team, she continues to offer freelance dressage instruction and training based on the principals of the classical training pyramid. Barb generally travels to her students' barns to teach. She also judges at schooling competitions as an L judge. Barb has recently been elected to the NODA Board as a Member at Large, and

hopes that members will take the time to introduce themselves and let her know how she can be their voice on the NODA Board. Barb has two horses. Latino (Tino) is Barb's retired Dutch

One of Laura's dreams was to have her own boarding stable. When I met Laura, we were riding in a grass paddock in her back yard. With determination and a lot of









Instead, I decided to describe a couple memorable moments that I think are worth elaborating upon for NODA members.

I had never heard Lauren Sammis speak in person before, but was particularly pleased by the useful insight she provided. Lauren was very amusing while being genuine at the same time. She made the room break out in laughter numerous times, which made for a more dynamic 8:00 discussion. Lauren spoke of her riding history. She insisted many times how she was "quite bad" at riding when she first started out. I can hardly believe that, knowing she rode Sagacious HF in the 2007 Pan Am Games, where she helped the U.S. earn the team Gold medal and earned an individual Silver medal. Lauren shared a couple of

memorable insights that I thought were relevant to all dressage riders.

• First off, Lauren said, "It's just circles." This was one sentence that made the room erupt in laughter. Her point? Dressage can be a very emotional sport, especially when training

obstacles arise. This statement was made as Lauren was drawing circles with her index finger. The point is to keep everything light in training and in daily life in general. We are not curing cancer; we are just riding circles.

A more poignant thought from Lauren came later when she said, "Some people in the world work to live. We work to do something we love." This statement is simple yet profound. As dressage riders, trainers, farm owners, or family members of people involved with horses, we are so fortunate to have a life involved with horses. If you are a professional in the equine industry you are blessed, in my opinion, to be able to work to do something you are passionate about and love to do.

While this was just one small discussion, there were countless quality talks that took place over the weekend. I was able to meet for the first time many individuals in the dressage community, which was exciting. I am very grateful for the USDF, USEF, The Dressage Foundation, Erica Minks, and Roz Kinstler for making the weekend a complete success. # Steffen Peters Aboard Ravel Repeats World Dressage Masters, Palm Beach Win

Peters and Ravel storming to their second consecutive sweep of the event. Their dramatic freestyle was very difficult and they were rewarded by the judges with a score of 83.70% and recognized with a standing ovation from the crowd. It was a narrow victory, Great Britain's Charlotte Dujardin gave Peters and Ravel a lot to handle but they held on by 5/100ths of a point. "What an amazing ride," said Peters. "Thanks again to my buddy Ravel."

Peters (San Diego, CA) and Ravel's incredibly difficult transitions, including from canter pirouette to piaffe to walk, were seamless. Ravel's half-pass has amazing reach at both the trot and the canter and the onetime changes on the centerline were effortless. The all-around brilliance gave this pair the edge - making them back-to-back World Dressage Masters Palm Beach Champions. "It was the ride of my lifetime, I've never done a better freestyle," said Peters. "He felt absolutely amazing - if we can just keep this for the next seven months." Of course, the Olympic Games in London take place July. Music from Avatar proved incredibly powerful and Ravel was full of confidence, from one difficult movement to the next "it was great," said Peters. "It felt wonderful. Ravel was even more powerful than last night - but relaxed in between for the walk tour." Peters wasn't confident after Dujardin went that he held his lead, the Brit was the last in the ring. "I felt like I was a team in the playoff who kicked a field goal with one second left," said

Peters after the scores were verified.

It was standing room only at the Jim Brandon Equestrian Center and eight horses took center stage to perform their CDI4\* Freestyles. Peters (San Diego, CA) broke his personal best in the Grand Prix on Friday and then refused to flinch in the face of tough competition. The now 14-year-old KWPN gelding has transformed into a major force in the dressage world for Peters and his owner Akiko Yamazaki from Four Winds Farm. They were fourth individually at the 2008 Olympic Games, won the 2009 Rolex/FEI World Cup Final, won two individual Bronze medals at the 2010 Alltech FEI World Equestrian Games and the 2011 World Dressage Masters. Peters has won USEF Equestrian of the Year honors three times, including for his 2011 Pan American Games double Gold medal effort in Mexico.

Dujardin rode confidently - after a slight bobble in the first centerline, she never gave up and got every conceivable point out of her lovely Dutch gelding. "I had a great ride..." said Dujardin. "He dealt with the atmosphere really well, today I felt like he was much more with me." He was a bit over the top in the Grand Prix and Dujardin was pleased to find him more rideable in the freestyle. "I felt like I had a bit more control today," said Dujardin.

The USEF offers its apologies to anyone who tried to watch the World Dressage Masters on the USEF Network. We had technical difficulties with our website and are continuing to troubleshoot. The production from both the World Dressage Masters and the Winter Equestrian Festival were excellent, and we look forward to showing both the Grand Prix Freestyle and the Nespresso Battle of the Sexes on demand shortly. 

# Laryngeal Hemiplegia by Melissa Milligan, DVM, MS, DACVS

aryngeal hemiplegia is a condition of the horse's throat that narrows the airway and leads to inspiratory noise, exercise intolerance, and poor performance. Affected horses are often referred to as "roarers" because of the noise they make during inhalation.

Laryngeal hemiplegia is defined as paralysis of one of the arytenoid cartilages. Because the arytenoid cartilage is paralyzed, it cannot open (abduction) to allow normal airflow. The cartilage remains within the airway when the horse inspires, preventing adequate air inflow and causing the noise and exercise intolerance typically identified in horses suffering from laryngeal hemiplegia. At rest, the paralysis has little effect on the horse's ability to inhale properly, but when larger amounts of air are required during strenuous exercise, the narrowed airway prohibits adequate air intake.

An upper airway endoscopic examination is necessary to diagnose laryngeal hemiplegia. During the examination, which should be conducted *without* sedation, the function of the different structures




Figure 2 depicts a Grade 4 Hemeplegia.

within the horse's throat is assessed, specifically the movement of the arytenoid cartilages.




Figure 1 depicts a normal larynx.

The arytenoid cartilages, sometimes referred to as "flappers," are positioned on the right and left sides of the larynx (Figure 1, letter A are the arytenoids). During normal inspiration the cartilages open wide to provide an unobstructed path for airflow, and during normal swallowing the cartilages close tightly to prevent any food from entering the trachea, or windpipe (Figure 1, letter B is the windpipe).

Arytenoid function is divided into four grades: Grade 1 indicates symmetric, synchronous movement of both cartilages with complete abduction and is considered normal; Grade 2 indicates some asynchronous, sluggish movement of one arytenoid but full abduction is obtained; Grade 3 identifies consistent asynchronous movements and full abduction cannot be maintained; Grade 4 indicates complete paralysis of one arytenoid, with no movement at all (see Figure 2).

Some horses with Grade 2 or 3 laryngeal hemiplegia require a dynamic upper airway endoscopic examination, which is performed simultaneously while the horse exercises on a treadmill or wears a specially designed portable endoscopic unit that attaches to the bridle. These horses can have a slightly abnormal examination at rest, and get progressively worse with exercise, making them ideal candidates for dynamic endoscopic examinations.

The most commonly affected horses are tall, longnecked horses such as thoroughbreds, standardbreds, draft horses, and warmbloods. The left side is affected in over 90% of the cases, usually for unknown reasons.

Successful treatment of laryngeal hemiplegia requires surgery, and several different options exist. The best option is a procedure termed a tie-back, or laryngoplasty. A prosthetic suture is placed behind the affected arytenoid cartilage, physically tying it in the "open" position. The next best option is to perform a ventriculectomy. This procedure removes the vocal saccules (Figure 1, letter C indicates the saccules), which helps to widen the airway and reduce the noise. Sometimes these two options are performed on the same horse simultaneously for best results. Draft horses are most frequently treated with a ventriculectomy, as this procedure can be performed in the standing, sedated horse and eliminates the potential complications associated with anesthesia in draft horses. If the ventriculectomy does not provide enough relief, a tieback can be performed at a later date. As a last

resort, if the tie-back fails, an arytenoidectomy, or removal of the paralyzed arytenoid, can be performed.

Horses are hospitalized for 4-6 days for a tie-back, and 36-72 hours for a ventriculectomy. A 6 week recovery period is required for the tie-back, after which the horse can return to training. The 6 weeks are divided between stall rest with hand walking and small paddock turnout. A ventriculectomy requires 21-24 days of exercise restriction, after which the horse may return to training. Depending on the discipline in which the horse competes, the success rate (meaning resolution of the noise and return to normal breathing ability) can be 60% to 85%. Racehorses have lower success rates because of the severe stresses placed upon the airway at race speed, while horses competing in other less strenuous disciplines have higher success rates.

She then completed a private practice internship at Equine Medical Associates in Edmond, Oklahoma followed by an intensive 3 year equine surgical residency at Kansas State University training under one of the Nations most experienced surgeons, Dr. Warren Beard. She received her Master of Science degree in Veterinary Clinical Sciences from Kansas State University. Dr. Milligan then joined The Equine Specialty Hospital where she continues her interest in colic surgery, and in addition, develops the hospitals MRI program. 


