### **NODA Newsletter to Return to Mailboxes** by Dee Liebenthal

fter a lot, and I mean A LOT, of thoughtful discussion, the NODA board has voted to begin mailing the NODA Newsletter again to all our members. Starting in January, your hard copy will reappear in your mailboxes. We hope you will share it with those at your barn, your family, friends, and other horse enthusiasts. 2013 will be a test year. Once we get started we will do a survey of all members and request your feedback.

Members who read and enjoy the online version may be wondering why we are doing this. Generic research on the subject of online vs. hard copy newsletters for non-profit organizations indicates that we may not be reaching our entire membership. Our population is very diverse in many ways and we need to reach everyone. We have also received enough feedback from members to lead us to conclude that many members don't spend as much time reading the reducing the number of pages), and whether we are online version as they did the hard copy. This, of course, continues to evolve as our population changes. We also find that our advertisers may not be getting the exposure that they got with hard copy. Less bang for their buck could equate to less interest in advertising with us. The online version isn't carried and passed around, shared with friends, or left in tack shops and barns for others to see.

Currently we mail about 60 copies of the newsletter to members who pay a little extra for the service because they do not have internet access, or for

various reasons do not want to read it on line. But that small increase doesn't begin to cover the cost of those 60 issues. NODA loses the use of our bulk mailing permit when we mail fewer than 200 copies. Compare postage of .30/issue for bulk mailing to \$1.95/issue without. Our membership averages between 275 and 300; therefore, we don't have a lot of wiggle room. We could offer an opt-out for everyone who doesn't want the newsletter mailed to them, but we would run the risk of 101 members opting out and, as a result, lose the bulk mailing discount. If we were a larger organization that is exactly what we would do, but we aren't and we are not likely to grow to 400 members any time soon.

We will revisit this whole process once again next year, taking into consideration your feedback, how well we are able to reduce printing costs (by slightly able to increase revenue by encouraging more advertising.

We know that those of you who grew up with computers enjoy the online version. It will still be available, of course. It is colorful and more visually appealing than the black and white printed version. But our non-profit status depends on us getting educational information out to our members. If we are not reaching our members, we are not doing our job. Let's see how it plays out. We appreciate your understanding and cooperation.





### Michael Poulin and Ravel Named 2012 Roemer Foundation/USDF Hall of Fame Inductees

Lexington, KY (October 18, 2012) - The United States Dressage Federation (USDF) is pleased to announce that Michael Poulin and Ravel will be inducted into the Roemer Foundation/USDF Hall of Fame (HOF) at the Salute Gala and Annual Awards Banquet, on December 8, 2012, during the Adequan/USDF Annual Convention in New Orleans, LA. Induction into the HOF is an honor bestowed on horses and individuals that have made outstanding contributions to the sport of dressage in the United States.

Michael Poulin has shown a lifelong commitment to furthering dressage, and dressage education, in the U.S. He has been a well known and successful competitor, trainer, instructor and judge. Part of the U.S. bronze medal team at the 1992 Barcelona Olympics, Michael rode 1997 Roemer Foundation/USDF Hall of Fame Inductee Graf

George, and shared the limelight with one of his students, Carol Lavell. Michael was instrumental in the founding of the USDF Instructor/Trainer Program and founded The Dressage Foundation's "Advanced Young Rider Olympic Dream Program". An FEI 4\*/I and USEF "S" Judge, Michael has also served, and continues to serve, in various volunteer roles within several equine organizations, including USDF, USEF and The Dressage Foundation. Ravel, a 14 year-old, dark bay, Dutch Warmblood gelding has awed crowds nationally, and internationally, since he entered the competition arena in 2008, with his rider Steffen Peters. Akiko Yamazaki and her husband, Jerry Yang, purchased Ravel in 2006 from Tim Coomans, Netherlands, with the goal of Ravel being Steffen's mount at the 2008 Beijing Olympics. The pair went on to meet that goal, representing the U.S. at the Beijing Games and placing fourth individually. In 2009, Ravel and Peters took first at the Rolex FEI World Cup, beating out nine-time World Champion Anky van Grunsven. Later that same year, the pair went on to write history once more by placing first in all three tests at CDIO Aachen. This was the first time an American combination had ever achieved this feat. Ravel's list of accomplishments also includes being named the 2009 USEF Farnam/Platform Horse of the Year; 2010 Chronicle of the Horse's Horse of the Year; 2009, 2010 and 2011 Adequan/USDF Grand Prix Horse of the Year; individual bronze medalist at the 2010 Alltech FEI World Equestrian Games and competing in the 2012 Olympics in London.

USDF President George Williams said, "It is a real pleasure, this year, to be honoring two Olympians. One is a horseman and the other a horse. Even though their Olympic debuts were sixteen years apart, they have a lot in common. Not only were their contributions to the sport in the U.S. outstanding, but each of them had an impact on the international scene as well. Both continue to inspire us, as they have shown what can be achieved through hard work, talent and generosity."




