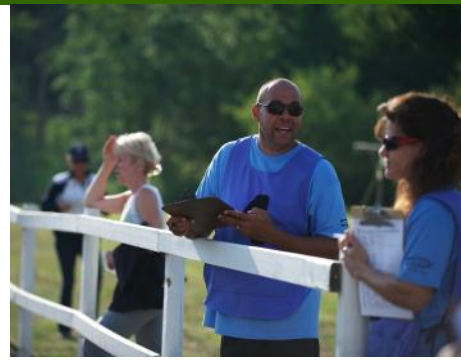

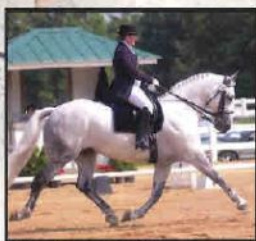

Interview with an Equine Professional Featuring Dr. Jeni Hren Gaffney, DVM Talking About What You Need to Know When You Transport Your Horse Across State Lines

At the last NODA board meeting both NODA's recognized show secretary Mary Lou Gallagher and Schooling Show Manager Chris Goodall commented on how many competitors question why their horse needs a negative Coggins in order to compete. With the dressage regional finals fast approaching, we thought this would be a great time to check in with area Vet Jeni Hren Gaffney to educate us on the need for a Coggins as well as what is necessary for a horse being transported across state lines and stabled temporarily away from home. Below are Dr. Gaffney's answer's.

Why does my horse need a Coggins?

The Coggins test was developed by Leroy Coggins to test for Equine Infectious Anemia (EIA), which is transmitted by biting insects. Horses can be inapparent carriers (they are infected but are not showing signs of disease), allowing them to easily spread the disease undetected. Horses that test positive must be euthanized or quarantined for life. Horse shows require owners to provide a Coggins test that is dated within six months or one year – depending on the state – of that particular competition in an effort to protect all horses on the grounds. Coggins tests are also required to cross state lines and any time a horse is being sold.

What inoculations are recommended if I transport and stable my horse away from home for clinics, shows and other activities?

Influenza and Rhinopneumonitis are the main diseases which are spread horse-to-horse by aerosol transmission. These are viral diseases which can be prevented by vaccination. Unfortunately, the immune stimulation from the vaccines is very short so boosters must be given every three to six months.

Strangles is caused by the bacteria *Streptococcus Equi*. Transmission is mainly by contaminated objects. There is an intra-nasal vaccination available for this disease.

What do I need to know about transporting my

horse across state lines?

When transporting horses across state lines, it is very important to check the requirements for transport into the state. Most states require a Health Certificate (CVI) issued within the past 30 days by a veterinarian. Certain states have specific requirements or may request further tests, such as piroplasmosis and/or a statement about vesicular stomatitis (V.S.). Some states (Illinois and Kentucky) require an entry permit. Your veterinarian is an excellent resource when you are planning to transport your horse.

If you are using a professional hauler, be sure to check beforehand the documentation they require when the horse is picked up so you are not unprepared. The website www.usrider.org has the transportation requirements by state and individual state website links.

What are some tips or precautions to help protect the health of my horse when stabled away from home?

Biosecurity is the new buzz word within the equine show world. We cannot keep our horses isolated at shows, but we can follow these simple rules:

- Do not allow your horse to touch other horses, especially nose-to-nose
- Do not share equipment (water buckets, feed tubs, sponges, etc.)
- Wash hands frequently after helping other people with their horses
- Don't let strangers pet your horse
- Graze your horse away from the community areas
- Keep vaccinations up-to-date, especially flu/rhino. Discuss a vaccination protocol for your barn with your veterinarian. If one horse is being shown, then all of your horses need to be vaccinated
- Ideally, isolate all horses that have been off your property and all new arrivals for at least two weeks
- Disinfect equipment and boots before leaving show grounds
- Shower and change clothes when you get home before you go near other horses

The USDA has an excellent pamphlet on biosecurity.

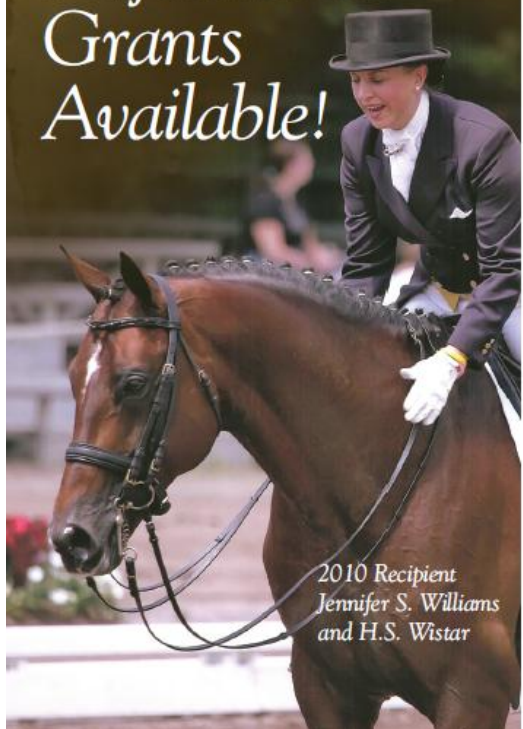

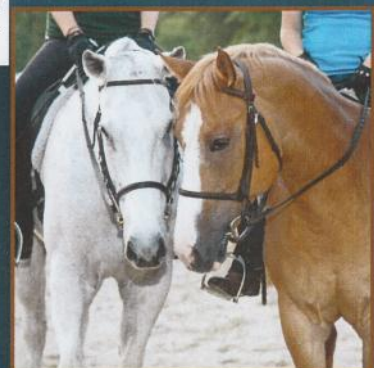
