- \Rightarrow We will offer team competitions at three of our schooling shows this season.



of the sport, and we can't start them too early. Get those kids in the show ring! No better place to start than at a NODA schooling show.


We will all be able to order NODA logo items through Big Dee's in the near future. The details should be available soon.

Western dressage is similar to Classical dressage in that it is based on the same six principles of the German Scale relaxation, rhythm, contact, impulsion, straightness and collection. Western dressage however, emphasizes principles of straightness, control of the front end of the horse, control over the hind end of the horse, collection and canter departures. These principles are demonstrated by the horse and rider team in test levels ranging from introductory (walk/trot) to basic (walk/trot/canter) to level one, level two and to freestyle. The tests are regulated by the United States Equestrian Federation (USEF) as




