Schooling Show News: Are you ready to have a great time again this year? 2017 is shaping up to be another fun schooling show series at a variety of venues, and managed by a dedicated group of NODA volunteers. Gwen Samuels is ready to hit the ground running as our new Secretary. She will be working closely with Sally Burton, our now seasoned Manager and Chairperson. We are so excited to get started and will kick off our series May 21st at Lake Erie College Equestrian Center. We have one important change that we want to keep in front of competitors throughout the season. **Please take note:**

- **Change in requirement for Schooling Show Championship:** NODA members need volunteer hours to apply for NODA Year-End Awards, and volunteers are needed at our schooling shows. To these ends, a new Schooling Show Championship requirement has been added. Effective immediately, a minimum of four (4) volunteer hours must be earned at a NODA Schooling Show, in addition to the requisite qualifying scores. This new requirement is a win-win for NODA and NODA competitors.

Change in NODA's Professional Grant: Great news for any NODA Professional interested in furthering their education. At March's Board meeting, we voted to raise the amount of each grant to \$400. Instead of awarding five \$200 grants, we can now award three \$400 grants. Please check out the NODA website [Scholarships](#) page for more information. 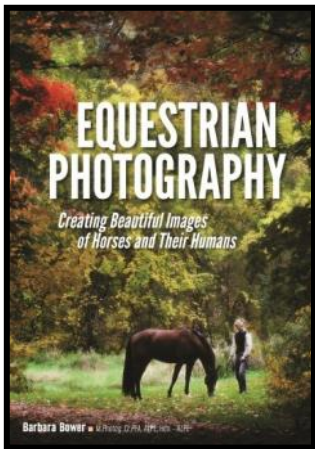

Equestrian Photography!

Ansel Adams once quoted, "The single most important component of a camera is the twelve inches behind it!" How true! We all have the capacity to own a camera but that doesn't make us photographers. This art transforms reality beyond to reveal more than what we see. Our own NODA member **Barbara Bower**, is such an artist.

Many of our NODA members personally know equine photographer Barbara Bower as a quiet petite equestrian and most have enjoyed her ability to artistically capture horse and rider to create memorable and often surreal photographs. It was my privilege to recently interview our esteemed member and report her latest accomplishment of authoring her first solo book! It is entitled:



Equestrian Photography - Creating Beautiful Images of Horses and their Humans.

Barbara is unassuming about her credentials, so I will report that she is a graduate of the Rhode Island School of Photography, and she has studied with some of the finest artists and photographers in the field. She holds the Master of Photography and Photographic Craftsman Degrees from the Professional Photographers of America. Additionally, she holds the accolade of Lifetime Photographic Excellence Degree from Wedding and Portrait Photographers. She has received numerous honors and awards in her field, but this latest solo book milestone is an amazing achievement.

And so, I asked her...

R: What prompted you to write a book about equestrian photography?

Barbara: I had co-authored a previous book and since that time, the publisher was interested in this type of equestrian photography book.

R: How did you first get started in photography?

Barbara: I got started in photography way back in junior

high school when I took a student resource test to pinpoint things of interest for a career. The test came up with two main things as my interests. One was animal husbandry and the other was photography. At that point, I had never considered photography. However, when I was younger I worked on a Girl Scout badge for photography and really enjoyed the exercise. After the career resource test, I never looked back. In my senior year of photography school, I photographed my first wedding. Talk about being scared and nervous! I also entered my first photo competition that Kodak was sponsoring, and did quite well. The print was taken with my favorite film at the time (and still is)...infrared! After high school, I went to Rhode Island School of Photography. Once photography school was over, I worked for different studios over the next several years and each of them focused on different disciplines. I worked on photographing family portraits, and then onto weddings, moved into baby portraits and high school seniors. But my love for animals has never changed. In my younger years, I had asthma and allergies that were fairly intense and prohibited me from doing everything I wanted with dogs, and even horses. Eventually I grew out of them, thank goodness! I will never go without a dog in my life again! Nor the thought of not spending time with a horse (or pony!) and being able to ride, until it is physically not an option.

R: Why did you specialize in equestrian photography?

Barbara: Several reasons actually. With my diversified background in portraiture, photographing an owner with their horse made a lot of sense, since I understand posing and lighting. And because I am an equestrian myself, I know how to photograph horses and how to handle all different types of personalities that come with different horses. Both of those things make it easier to produce priceless images for my clients. I love the challenge that comes with working with these beautiful animals. And I realized after working in studio situations, that I get bored with the same backgrounds, standard controlled lighting and feel limited so going to different barns keeps me more creative and I enjoy it a lot more! I also love and appreciate the connection horse owners have with their partners! It is a very powerful bond that only those connected with that horse understand. It takes time and patience to make that bond, but when it happens it is very easy to portray in photos. I once had a client's husband remark that his wife never looked at him like she did with

her horse. I ducked when he made that comment, and yet understood. We have a very special bond with these very regal, powerful animals. They can take control of us so easily and yet they want and respect what we offer them. They give so much to us. I remark to people all of the time how horses are Zen-like. They don't wag their tails, but tell you in other ways that they want and enjoy being with you. They add a calming affect to our lives. A grounding affect we all need and crave. That is why they are so therapeutic for most riders of all abilities. They are very powerful physically, but mentally even more. Only those people close to them understand that. Yes, it is deep! That is why it is Zen-like! I'm getting off topic....

R: How did you prepare to compile and complete this book?

Barbara: First, I did research to find what other books have been published with the similar content. I actually could not find anything comparable. There are plenty of beautiful coffee table books but barely any books discussing the approach and thought process of photographing equestrians with their horses. So many photographers specialize in equine photography, but not equestrian photography. The difference is in adding the owner into the equation. After clarifying a need for this type of book, the publisher told me to compile around a hundred plus images for them to approve before they gave me the green light for the book. Once they did that, I put the images into categories and then wrote different explanations on how I approached that image and what I was looking to achieve. At first I wondered how I would make different comments about so many images, but once I started looking at the images one at a time I realized it wasn't that difficult. I had a lot to say!

R: What did you discover when authoring this book?

Barbara: Whenever you put together a project to speak in front of a group or to write a book, it makes you realize all of the thought that goes into what you are presenting. Putting my thoughts on paper helped me to define my thought process and make me even more aware of all of the things that I look at when photographing. Images included in this book range from Ohio to Hawaii to Florida and Canada and many locations in between.

R: How many photos are contained in your book?

Barbara: There are approximately 120 images in the book.

R: The cover photograph is of someone NODA members will easily recognize. How did you select it from the numerous wonderful photos you have taken over the years?

Barbara: The cover was fun because the publisher requested that I pick images for them to choose from for the cover. They requested that it be a vertical image and in color. That made the choices a little more challenging for me, since so most of my images are horizontal. Horizontal images are more common in my photography because of the shape of the horse and most of the time a horizontal image has more impact than a vertical image. The image they picked is one I took of Margaret McElhany and Willie. This image worked well as a vertical because the trees helped to frame the location where they were standing. The fall colors helped to make the image pop. Also, the placement of Margaret and Willie made it easy for placement of title, etc. But beyond all of the logistics the publisher had to really like the image and they actually told me it was a very hard decision.

In conversation with NODA professional **Margaret McElhany**, President of Valley Riding, Inc. I was able to obtain her comments about being chosen for the cover of this magnificent book:

R: Margaret, what was your reaction to finding out your photo was selected for the cover?

Margaret: I was very surprised and honored to be selected. The setting at Rocky River Reservation in the fall was just perfect, and my horse Willie is a great model. The picture lent itself well to a cover with the vertical exposure and space for titling.

R: What do you think Willie thinks about his newly-found fame?

Margaret: He likes to focus on eating, so I think he has high hopes for more treats and sweets!

R: When will your book be available?

Barbara: The book is currently available for pre-order via

R: What plans do you have for your photography future?

Barbara: I enjoy traveling, and one of my goals is to travel overseas and photograph clients, etc. I will continue to travel to other states across the USA to meet equestrians and their horses to offer them priceless images. I have also been working on another book. This next book will be on Mounted Police Units. I have been working on this project for several years and am looking forward to wrapping that book up this year and get it ready for publication. The format of this book will be a coffee table book. So far, I have been to Mounted Units from as far west as Seattle and Vancouver, South into Fort Worth where it is truly Quarter Horse country, North into Toronto with one of the largest Mounted Units I have come across, (not the Mounties, but real working Mounted Police), of course Kentucky, Lexington and Louisville, Chicago with its coordinated horse unit, Baltimore with the shoeless draft horses, and to the only Mounted unit left in the state of Connecticut. Plus several more! Cleveland included. I am trying to finish up my journey with two more this year, before I finish the book. It has been a journey of discovery I did not even expect.

R: Our readers know you are a rider too. Tell us about your horse and current riding pursuits?

Barbara: This past year a Fjord Pony named "FMF Apple Jack" found me! I wasn't looking for another partner! He caught me by surprise, but if you met him you would see why. Apple Jack is the favorite of the barn. A good friend of mine thought I was nuts that I bought a pony but when she met him she melted and completely understood. Everyone makes comments about him when he is out of his stall and strangers even seem to know his name. He seems to like everyone and everything, human and animal alike. He is one of the most personable ponies/horses I have ever met. To top it off, he is incredibly cute. Standing at only 13'2" hands high with a large forelock and a rare red dun color, he is adorable. Every time I go into his stall I can't believe

he is mine. At the age of 6, we still both have a lot to learn together and grow. And I can't believe at this age I have started another young horse! Am I crazy?! This past summer we did both NODA schooling shows at Rocky River Stables and participated in walk-trot classes and earned high point award for both shows in our division.

R: Anything else you wish to tell our readers?

Barbara: On Sunday April 23rd I will be presenting a program at Rocky River Stables at 1:00 PM about the Chincoteague/Assateague ponies. This trip had been on my bucket list and I decided it was only a drive, and I needed to make the excursion happen. I learned a lot by visiting the island and did not understand the "wild ponies" until I made the trip. Of course I have lots of photos but also lots of information on how and when to make the trip. Important!!! Please call me at 440.343.7051 to register for the program, as we have limited space! There will be door prizes and one of the prizes will be a one-on-one photography class and another will be a mini-session and print. Also, we are always looking for volunteers for our Valley Riding Therapeutic Program. We have a few open spaces for new riders as well. I have enjoyed coordinating volunteers for over a decade now. 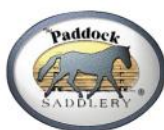

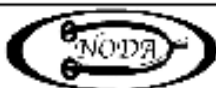
