In April 1987 Membership Dues were \$15 and NODA had 175 members.

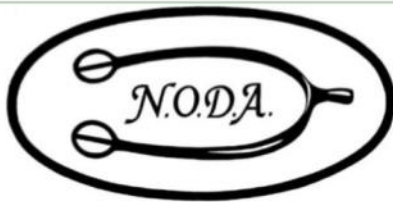
Some tips from a clinic given by Major Anders Lindgren were:

- Big horses, and older riders, may warm up best at the canter.
- One way to reward your horse is by posting the trot.

Some notes from 1974:

- NODA was incorporated.
- Dues were \$10.
- NODA bought an adding machine.
- It was decided to start giving ribbons at schooling shows in 1975.

At a February 1971 meeting, the main item was scheduling of a Musical Ride and Pot Luck Supper meeting for general membership at Red Raider with horses available for rent at cost of \$3.00.

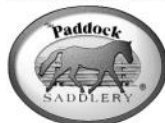

Charles de Kunffy – the Man, the Truth, and the Legacy Clinic Synopsis

As I watched Charles de Kunffy teaching this past weekend, I was reminded of a movie I recently watched about two magicians where one of them described the parts of a magic trick. The pledge, when the magician shows an ordinary object, and the turn, where the magician transforms that ordinary object into something extraordinary. In the movie, the magician claims that the audience does not really want to know their secret because that destroys the magic. But if your mind is anything like mine, you want to know how your favorite dressage riders are able to take seemingly any horse and magically transform them into an ethereal creature moving with a beauty and grace of which you can only dream. Lucky for us, Mr. de Kunffy was only too willing to share the secrets behind his magic, and even better, those secrets are nothing mystical, simply correct, progressive riding.

Magic Trick # 1 – How to plan and execute the perfect warm-up.

Start with four minutes of walk with frequent changes of rein. Then limber up at the trot with serpentines, half circles, get lateral bending. Next is transitions within gaits. The key is the transition not how long you keep the shortened or lengthened strides. You can add in canter work at this stage. Last in the warm up is the two track work. For a young horse this may be primarily leg yield, for the more advanced horse a combination of haunches in and out, shoulder in and out, half pass and pli   (a new term for me- at the canter a drifting towards the outside with the shoulders leading so that the hind legs never cross). These stages to the warm up gradually increase the engagement and suppleness, promote ambidexterity, and tell you what is missing that day so that you know where to focus your work.

Magic Trick # 2 – Creating Quintessential Contact.

Mr. de Kunffy repeatedly stressed that we are to ride the rings of the bit, not the mouthpiece. The horse should have the bit merely hanging in his mouth, never tight pressure. He convincingly demonstrated on multiple horses that a jiggle of the bit ring was more than sufficient

to ask your horse to give in the jaw and neck. An overly flexed horse is provoked by too much rein contact stopping the hindquarters, an inside rein that diminishes weight bearing, or a wide hand position which forces the head behind the vertical. The correction for over flexion is to slow down for three steps and frustrate the horse's eloquence of movement and collect the haunches, then abruptly give both reins so there is no contact and the horse finds himself in self-carriage, and third to drive the horse forward into that space so that they will establish an appropriate contact.

Magic Trick # 3 – Scare-proof Your Steed.

Horses are allowed to startle, they are not allowed to shy. Smart horses all have anxiety. (The greatest achievement in training a phlegmatic, comatose horse is that it woke up that day.) When your horse startles, that is in their nature, go with them as their partner. You make the decision of when to slow down again. But next time around, use leg yield or shoulder-in past that scary spot. The horse is in the haunches, so put the haunches by the scary spot. If your horse begins to snort or look, asking you whether or not they should be afraid, do not, I repeat, do not tighten the reins. You have more control with longer reins because then your seat is secure and you are not being pulled out of your deep seat. When the horse asks, be bored. Give the reins, as you go past a scary spot, and send the message that there is no reason to be fearful.

Magic Trick # 4 – Never Make a Mistake Again.

The secret behind this piece of magic is optimistic riding. Horses do not make mistakes, they simply do what they think we are telling them to do. So if the horse breaks from the canter, trot like you meant it, love that trot, and then figure out what you did that caused the horse to trot.

Did you come out of the saddle, lost your seat bone, ask for too much angle? Teaching is repeating, so calmly repeat the exercise and be aware of what your body is really telling the horse.

Magic Trick # 5 – Exemplary Engagement.

Ride the hind legs into a passive contact to shorten the horse from a long stick into a round ball. Another analogy Mr. de Kunffy used was a fisherman. We need to anchor ourselves like the fisherman standing on the shore reeling in the catch of a lifetime. The horse lifts their withers up like the fishing pole with a fish on the end of it. Part of getting the horse engaged is using your seat. The elbows must be at your sides for the horse to feel your seat bones. If your arms come up or out, you are no longer using your seat bones to engage the horse.

Magic Trick # 6 – Collect Your Canter Like a Celebrity.

The canter is a unilateral movement. Your seat bones should not move the same amount in the canter. Think about your seat bones like a kitchen door hinge. The outside seat bone is attached to the wall and does not move, the inside seat bone moves like the hinge swinging. To collect the canter, do not move the hinge as far, bring the inside shoulder back in rhythm with each stride, and keep your outside leg back from the hip so that your inside seat bone goes down and tells the horse to keep cantering.

Magic Trick # 7 – Stretch Your Horse's Topline.

Mr. de Kunffy demonstrated how effective lateral suppling is in getting a longitudinal stretch by an exercise where alternating haunches out to shoulder-in back and forth on a circle stretched the rib cage on both sides, and as soon as the rider started feeding out the reins the horse happily demonstrated a superb stretch over the topline with a forward and downward reach. The importance of teaching your horse to follow the reins down was brought back to basics, from a halt the reins were gradually fed out an inch at a time and the rider

waited at the halt until the horse followed the bit down and did not just walk off at the release of the reins.

Magic Trick # 8 – How to Be Competition Ready with 219 canters and 922 Trots.

Daily work is the place to exaggerate your bend, your lengthening and shortening of the stride, your two track angle. There is no second chance for a first centerline. By exaggerating at home, you can show off the correct movement on the first try at a show. At one point Mr. de Kunffy asked for the creepiest, most melancholy, disgustingly slow trot possible. There were no judges there to scream “lacks impulsion” and by consistent daily work at exaggerating what you are able to do, the adjustability of the gaits will increase.

Magic Trick # 9 – Have a Superlative Sitting Trot.

The best way to develop your seat is on the lunge line. More specifically doing tortuous exercises on the lunge line (leaning back and doing bicycles, etc). You have to earn the vertical seat. Lean back until you feel that you are moving in the wave of the horse's movement, feel that you are his kidneys, his liver.

Magic Trick # 10 – Develop ESP.

When a horse showed an evasion or resistance, Mr. de Kunffy was able to translate what the horse was saying for us mere mortals. A horse who had been going over-flexed with tension and kinetic energy was merely working out the kinks and spasms in his neck by flipping his head and hitting the bit once the reins were lengthened and he started to lower his head and neck. A tongue stuck out on the right, a horse with his head tilted to the side, and a horse taking short steps on the left were all protesting a too tight rein contact which prevented them from stepping through with their hind leg.

The 3rd part of a magic trick is the prestige. While there were many oohs and aahs watching the transformation of the riders over the course of the clinic, I very strongly believe that the only prestige needed by Mr. de Kunffy was to see the contented horse stretching at the end of his ride, feeling proud of all he had accomplished for his rider that day.

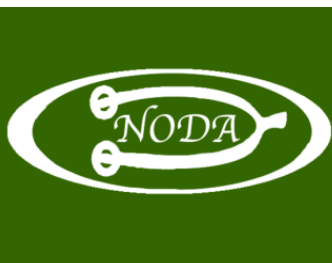

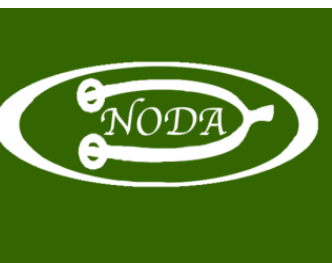
